On motion of Councillors Thorn and Burns that Reeve and Clerk attend the meeting on Thursday morning in the Council Chamber at 9 a.m. to meet the officials of the C.N.R. and Council were all in favour of keeping the service on. Carried.

On motion of Councillor Burns and Deputy-Reeve Bradburn that we pay into the Supreme Court \$400.00, re the settlement of the land of Mr. C. Seymour taken as a right of way, and the Road Superintendent be instructed to erect a fence on both sides of the right of way, and give Mr. Seymour the wood. Carried.

On motion of Councillors Thorn and Howden that we accept the rental from the County of \$350.00 yearly for a period of 10 years for one-fifth of the municipal garage. Carried.

Mr. Wm. Seymour and Mr. D. Nill addressed the Council re the Tile Drainage Act, they presented to Council a petition with twenty-six names on same requesting the Council to pass the By-Law, as they all wished to take advantage of the Act, and have drainage done on their farms by paying 25% of amount of work done, and then paying the Township in November when the taxes are due the yearly rate plus interest on money borrowed. The Township to issue the debentures and be responsible, re the payment of principle and interest each year for the number of years debentures are issued for.

On motion of Councillors Thorn and Howden that according to petition before us that we consider the Tile Drainage Act, and the Clerk be directed to publish Form 3 giving notice to consider the By-Law in The Peterborough Examiner also The Millbrook Mirror-Reporter once a week for the next three

On motion of Councillors Howden and Thorn that the correspondence be received and filed, the Clerk to answer any not already dealt with. Carried.

Collector's report—In the month of April \$4047.16 had been collected, he handed in letters that had been sent to him, re outstanding taxes, also gave in a list recommending them to be registered.

On motion of Deputy-Reeve Bradburn and Councillor Howden that report be received, and collector asked to carry on and use more force to collect outstanding taxes. Carried.

Mr. J. Whittington and Mr. Heaslip addressed the Council, asking for their approval, re the building of two additional rooms on the School at Bailieboro at approximate cost of \$39,740.00 debentures to be issued at a twenty year period, thus closing the other schools in South Monaghan and making this a consolidated school in Bailieboro.

On motion of Deputy-Reeve Bradburn and Councillor Burns that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Cavan approve of the building of two additional rooms to the Bailieboro Public School at an approximate cost of \$39,740.00 debentures to be issued for a 20 year period. Carried.

Mr. Donald Cathcart addressed the Council, re the hiring of the grader within the next two weeks, as he was building a barn and wished ground levelled. The Reeve said the Road Supt. would try and arrange a date with Donald when it would be suitable to both parties.

On motion of Councillors Thorn and Howden that we accept the rental from the County of \$350.00 yearly for a period of 10 years for one-fifth of the municipal garage. Carried.
