C.N.R. TELLS OF HABITS OF COUNTRY TO PROSPECTIVE VISITORS

Toronto, May 1958.—The story of Ontario's varied attractions is being told in the homes of Americans from Vermont to the Virgin Islands. Numerous travel "plugs" contained in recorded talks from the New York public relations office of Canadian National Railways are being carried by over 400 radio stations in 43 American states.

The series of 26 broadcasts entitled "This Is Canada" began in March. The promotions of Ontario will be carried during the weeks of May 19, 26 and June 2 as "Toronto and the Niagara Peninsula," "Ottawa, the National Capital" and "Stratford Shakespearean Festival."

A later programme will feature "Ontario and the St. Lawrence Seaway."

The narration is by Peter Roberts, Canadian-born commentator for News Of The Day and communicator on the National Broadcasting Company's weekend radio programme Monitor.

His word picture will take Americans from coast to coast in Canada, to resort areas, big cities and small towns. He is giving advice on border crossing and suggestions for comfort and sensible clothing for Canadian vacation and business trips.

Rounding out the programme is a selection of Canadian folk music, traditional songs and recordings from the Stratford festival.

The CNR recordings have been compiled following the success of a series last year which featured Canadian regional recipes, and which were carried similarly over a selected group of radio stations in various parts of the United States.

Some of the general titles being heard in this year's broadcasts are "Canada, Our Northern Neighbour;" "The Ease of Border Crossing;" "Milady's Wardrobe in Canada;" "Canadian Train Travel;" "Canadian Shopping Tips;" "Canadian Handicrafts and Character;" "Canada, Its People and Its Weather;" and "Canada in Review."

A famous statue in an art gallery overseas portrays a Saint with arms missing and thus presses home the truth—"God hath no hands but our hands, to do His work today."

People grow discouraged and perplexed in these days when confronted with severe and prolonged illness, business worries and lack of security in world affairs through wars and rumours of war, and keep asking "Does God really care?" The compassionate Jesus assures his followers "He that hath seen me, hath seen the Father" and therefore God is a God who really cares". John 14:9. There is no tear shed on earth, but God feels it in Heaven.

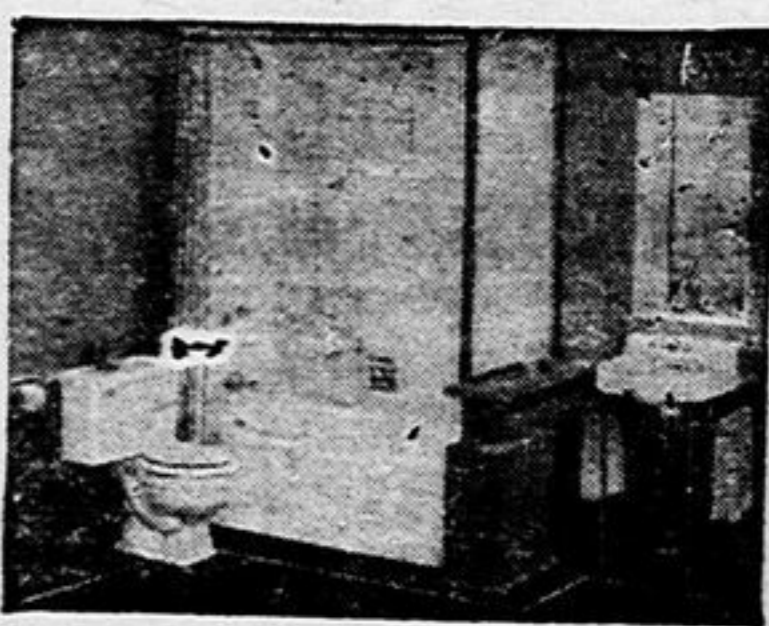

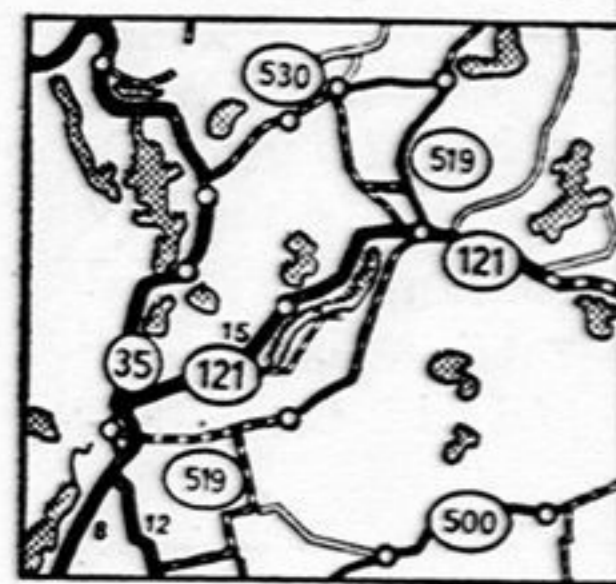
