MANVERS TOWNSHIP AWARDS CONTRACT TO BETHANY MAN

Bethany, Ont., May 6, 1958. —The regular monthly meeting of the Manvers Municipal Council was held on the above date with all members present and Reeve Argue in the chair.

The minutes of the April regular meeting and a special meeting on April 12th, 1958, were read and approved on motion of Malcolm and Brown. Carried.

The following communications were received and read: Counties Clerk re two indigent patients in Peterborough Civic Hospital; Consumers Gas Co. re certificate from the Ontario Fuel Board; Several requests from Grader Manufacturers for tender forms re purchase of new grader; N. and D. Health Unit monthly report; Dept. of Municipal Affairs re information regarding the authority of a Municipality to authorize the pulling down or repair of undesirable living quarters; Also the authority of a Municipality to impose a 4% penalty on all due taxes after December 15th, in the case of the Township of Manvers; Green Cross Products, price list re brush killer and weed spray; Ewart Huycke correspondence regarding assisting our new Assessor, Mr. Johnston and others.

By-law No. 1348, appointing Mr. Alfred Johnston, Assessor for the Township of Manvers was given the three necessary readings, signed, sealed and numbered.

Moved by Jakeman, seconded by Malcolm that the Township of Manvers ask for an arbitration with the Victoria County District High School Board in accordance with the Secondary Schools and Boards of Education Act 1954, Chap. 87, sub. sec. 33 (6). Carried.

Moved by Brown, seconded by McGill that the Clerk open the tenders for the supplying of gravel as per call of tender in the Daily Commercial News. Carried.

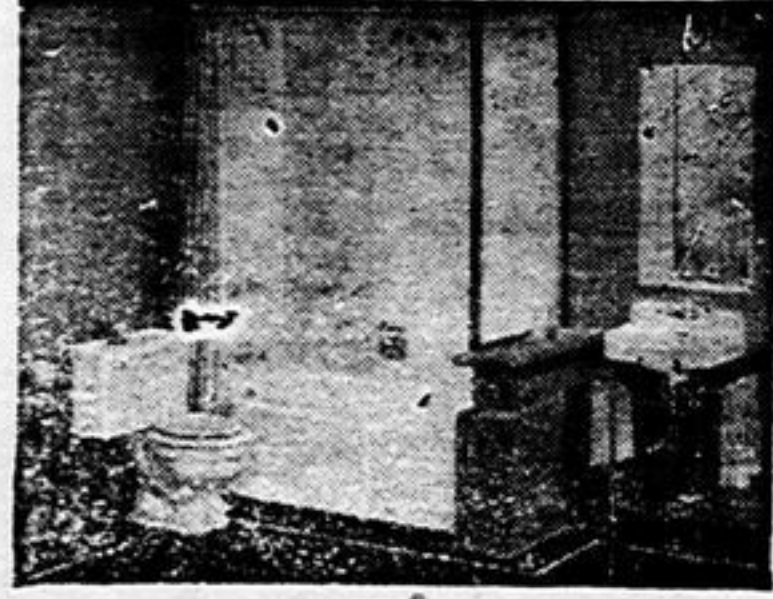
