OBITUARY

JAMES SIDNEY NELSON

The service for James Sidney Nelson, 69, of Fraserville, who died of heart attack on Tuesday, May 10, was conducted by the Rev. Edgar Palfrey, Padre of the Canadian Legion Millbrook Branch 402, in the J. W. Haw Funeral Home on Thursday.

Son of John Nelson and the former Margaret Graham, Mr. Nelson was born in Manvers Township, but for 39 years he had lived on his Fraserville farm. In World War I he served almost four years, first with the 136th Battalion; he was gassed and wounded.

Surviving are his widow, the former Iva Powell, sons John James, Peterborough; Ivan Neal of Ida; Lloyd Sidney of Millbrook; daughter Gloria, Mrs. Barrie Fee, Peterborough, and 11 grandchildren; and sisters Rhea, Mrs. William Jordan of Bethany; Hazel, Mrs. John Kerr of Franklin; Margaret, Mrs. Hilgard McMahon of Bailieboro.

Neighbours were pallbearers: Donald Lang, Chris Peterson, James Dawson, Elmer Hogg, Wilfred Elson and Leonard McNeill.

Wednesday evening the Rev. Edgar Palfrey and President R. John Payne conducted the Canadian Legion Service for almost 100 Legionnaires and Ladies of the Auxiliary.

Interment was in St. John's Cemetery, Ida.

The funeral service was held May 9, 1960 for W. A. (Gus) Ferguson, in his 78th year, who died Thursday, May 5, at the home of his niece, Mrs. Stan Olan, Millbrook.

The remains were sent by train for burial service in St. Paul's Presbyterian Church in Banff, Alberta.

The Rev. Gordon A. Peddie conducted the burial service in Banff Cemetery. The Jacques Funeral Home conducted the funeral.

Mr. Ferguson was born in Hamilton Township, and lived in Kendal, Ontario until he went to Calgary in 1910.

He married Georgina Gardner in 1912. She predeceased him in 1956. He farmed in the Calgary district for 35 years before going to Banff in 1946, where he operated the Otterbee Lodge until 1957, when he retired. He has been in poor health until the time of his death. Pallbearers were J. E. Brown, Jack McAulay, Jim Lamb, George Moore, Joe Hume and Fred Prozny. He leaves a brother in law and two sisters in law in Millbrook; a brother in law J. E. Brown, Calgary; a sister in law in Kelowna, B. C. and neices, nephews, cousins.

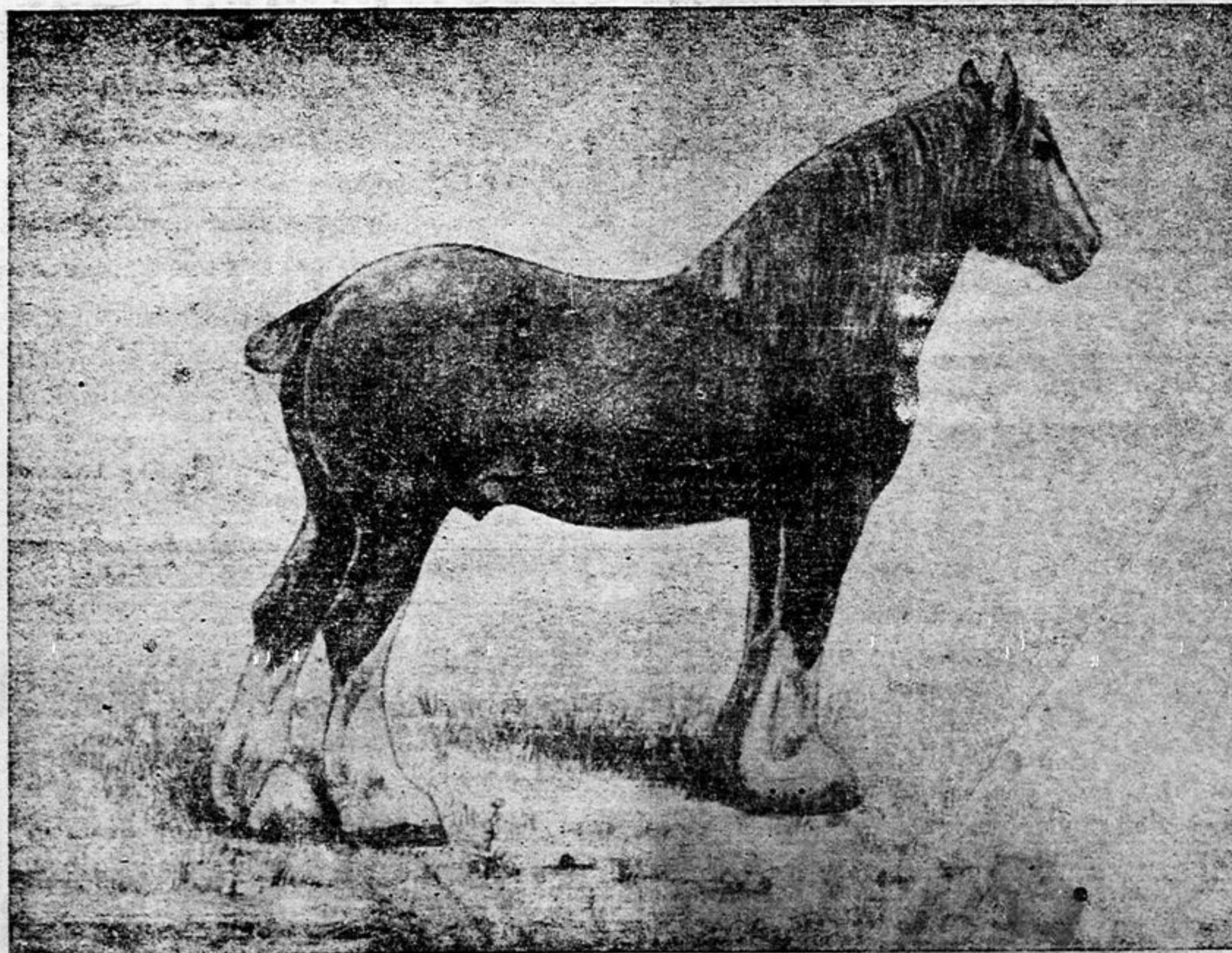
