Manvers Twp. Council Minutes

Bethany, Ont. June 3, 1958.

The regular monthly meeting of the Manvers Municipal Council was held on above date with all members present and Reeve Argue presided.

The minutes of the May meeting were read and approved on motion of McGill and Malcolm. Carried.

The following communications were received and read:— Dept. of Agriculture enclosing forms to apply for grant in connection with the Warble Fly programme. Two letters from cottage owners, requesting that a tree be cut down and the road improved at Viewlake. United Counties Clerk, notifying the Township that part payment of the County levy could be made in advance of the usual date and a discount would be allowed. The United Counties levy for 1958 was received and the amount of \$21,854.16 being due on or before December 20th, 1958. Northumberland and Durham Health Unit monthly report. Dept. of Highways re the approval of road expenditures for 1958 to the amount of \$32,000.00. Two sheep claims were received and others.

Mr. Henry Jakeman thanked members of the Council and Township employees for the present his wife and him had received, on the occasion of their 50th wedding anniversary. Mr. D. E. Gorrie, Municipal Engineer from Port Hope was present and discussed with the Council the matter of purchasing a new power grader.

A Supplementary By-Law for \$17,000.00 was given the three necessary readings, signed, sealed and numbered 1349 on motion of McGill and Jakeman. Being an additional amount required for the road appropriation for the year 1958.

Mr. David Master called on the Council and discussed the matter of weed spraying for 1958.

After carefully reviewing the tenders for the supplying of a new grader and interviewing the representatives of a number of the manufacturers the following motion was recorded. Moved by Jakeman, seconded by Malcolm that the tender of Dominion Road Machinery Co. be accepted, subject to the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board. Carried.

The net price of the new grader being \$16,350.00 which was the lowest tender received. Moved by Jakeman, seconded by Brown that a grant of \$25,000.00 be made to the Millbrook Agricultural Society. Carried.

Moved by Councillor Harvey Malcolm, seconded by Councillor Robert Brown, that the Municipal Council of the Township of Manvers petition the Ontario Municipal Board to grant approval to the said Township of Manvers to purchase a new diesel motor grader, snow plow and wing, at a total cost of \$26,600.00, less trade-in allowance of a Model 512 Adams, being \$19,250.00, leaving a net price of \$16,350.00. AND WHEREAS tenders have been duly called for and six tenders being duly received. The Township of Manvers propose to borrow the money required from The Toronto-Dominion Bank, Bethany, Ontario, to purchase the said grader; the arrangements of which have been fully made. AND WHEREAS the Township of Manvers intend to levy for 50% of its share of the capital cost in the 1958 levy and to levy for the further 50% in the 1959 levy.

AND WHEREAS the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board is required in order to carry part of the money owing Bank into the 1959 levies.

Municipality of Millbrook

BY-LAW NO. 849.

A By-Law to prohibit the Obstruction of any Drain or Watercourse and to Permit and Regulate the size and mode of Construction of Culverts and Bridges which cross any drain or watercourse situate on a Public Highway.

WHEREAS, by virtue of subsection 61 of section 405 of the Municipal Act, power is given a local Municipality to pass a by-law for prohibiting the obstruction of any drain or watercourse and for permitting and regulating the size and mode of construction of culverts and bridges which cross any drain or watercourse situate on a public highway.

The Corporation of the Village of Millbrook therefore enacts as follows:

- 1—Except as hereinbefore provided no person or persons or corporation shall obstruct any drain or watercourse situate on a highway forming a part of the Village road system.
- 2—Where the person occupying land adjacent to any such highway is desirous of having a culvert or bridge constructed from such land over a drain or watercourse to the highway, such person shall make application to the Clerk of the Corporation in writing and if granted, the Engineer shall have sole authority in directing the size and mode of construction of such culvert or bridge.
- 3—The total cost of the construction shall be borne by the applicant. The estimated cost of such work shall be deposited with the said Clerk, before any work is commenced. Any shortage or over charge shall be promptly paid as soon as the work is completed, by the debtor party.
- 4—The said culvert or bridge remains the property of the Corporation and any future repairs considered necessary by the Engineer, shall be carried out under the Engineer, and at the cost of the said Corporation.
- 5—Any such Culvert or Bridge may at any future date be entirely removed, or may be reconstructed at any section of the highway if so considered necessary by the Engineer.
- 6—Any person contravening any of the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a conviction under the Summary Convictions Act, and may be liable to a fine not exceeding \$50.00 (exclusive of costs) or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 21 days or to both.
- 7—"Highway", under this Act shall mean a common or public highway street, avenue, parkway, driveway, square, place, bridge, viaduct or trestle, designed for, or used by the general public for the passage of vehicles.
- 8—"Engineer", shall mean the Village Engineer when such is employed. In the absence of such the Chairman of the Streets, Roads and Bridges Committee, shall act.
