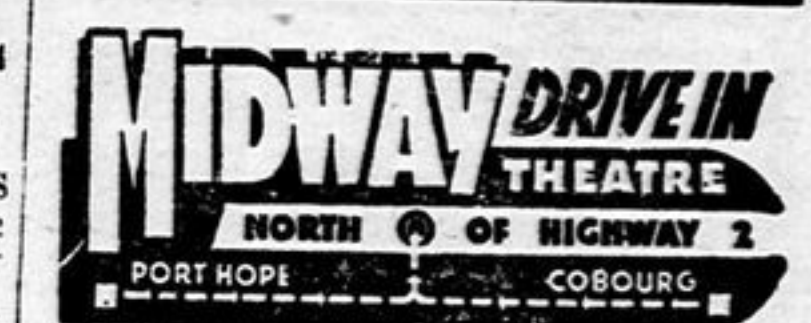
CHURCH PARADE AT BAILIEBORO JUNE 14th

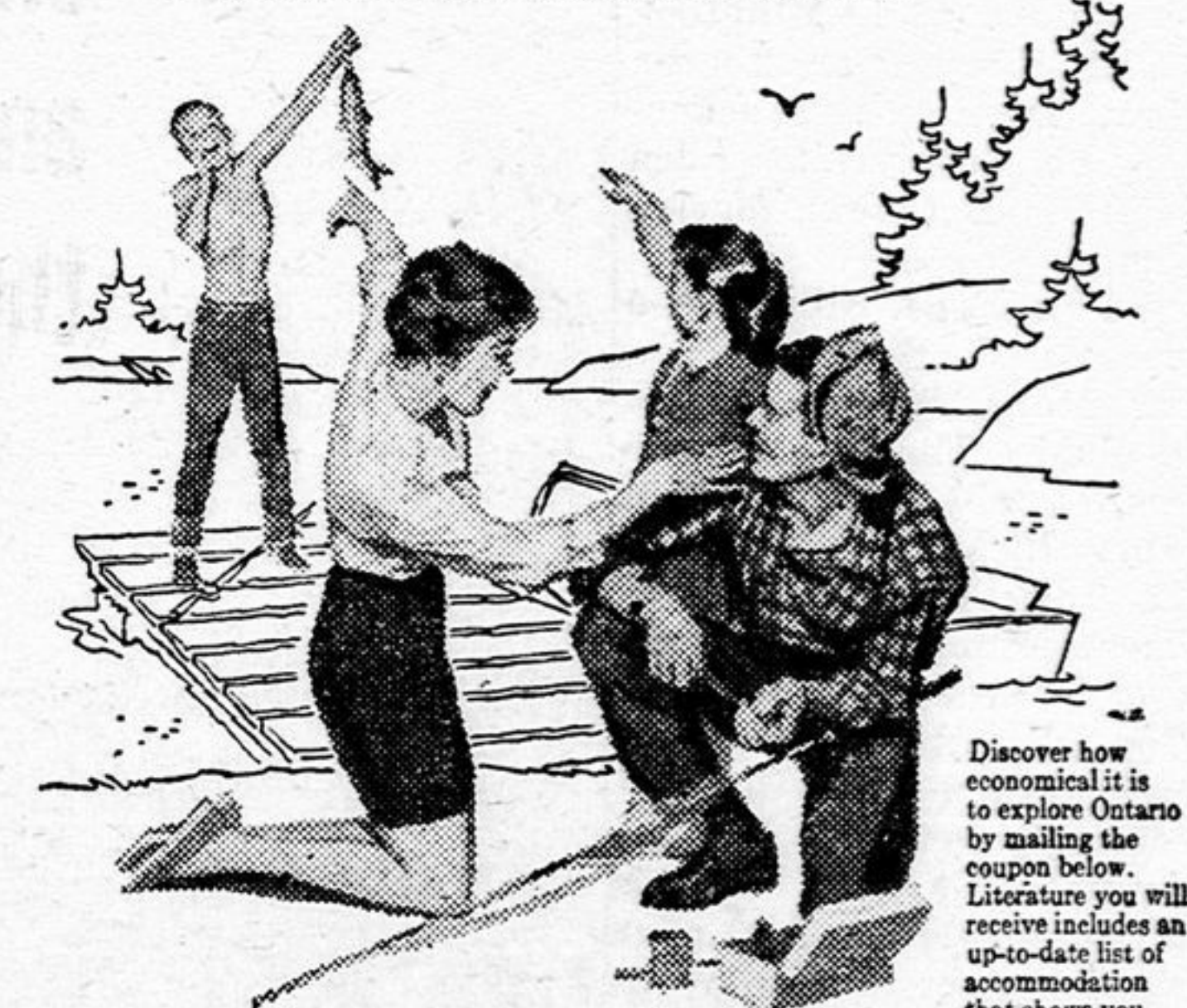

Farm income has become stabilized at the relatively depressed levels to which it has slipped from the peak year of 1951. The farmer is still at the mercy of profiteers both when he sells his products and when he buys his supplies and equipment. The price spreads problem has become so urgent that it has been referred by the federal government for investigation; but meanwhile the farmer's share of the consumer's \$ drops every year.

While "contract farming" may offer some benefits by underwriting a few of the economic hazards in agriculture, there is no doubt that farmers have been driven to it chiefly because of the desperate shortage of credit available to them. As farming has more become a business, private sources have refused, and governments have failed to develop credit facilities for agriculture. If the federal government does not meet the farmers' full credit needs, then the provincial government must do so—and a CCF Government will.
