

### Induction Service, Grace Church

Before a capacity audience, representative of the congregations of Grace Presbyterian Church, Millbrook and Centreville Church, South Monaghan, Rev. Gerald Graham of Renfrew was inducted on Monday evening.

This charge had been made vacant when Rev. W. H. Heustein received a call to Beamsville in April 1958.

Rev. Mr. Graham, graduated from Knox College, Toronto, this year received the call to Centreville and Millbrook charge May 11, having preached here, the preceding Sunday. He was ordained into the ministry in his home church in Renfrew on Wednesday, May 27th and preached there on the following Sunday.

The Induction Service held in Grace Church, Millbrook, on Monday evening was in charge of Rev. Dr. Hutchison, M.A., B.D., Moderator of the Presbytery of Peterborough.

Rev. R. T. Rietherdale, most recently inducted minister of Presbytery, and minister of Hastings and Warkworth, delivered a challenging message from the text—"He Went a Little Further", calling us all to go the extra mile, especially in the matter of religion. We are too often content to stop too soon. But in the service of God, we must not. The work for Christ and His Kingdom has only one enterprise, one ideal, and one hope, so we must press on a little further.

Rev. G. Smith of St. Giles Church, Peterborough, Interim Moderator of charge, narrated the steps that had been taken

to fill the vacancy. Dr. Hutchison asked the required questions from minister elect.

The Reading of the Formula was read by Rev. James D. C. Jack, B.A., of St. Andrew's Church, Cobourg, who is Clerk of Presbytery, to which the new minister elect gave his signature, thus indicating his assent to the doctrinal standards and government of the Presbyterian Church.

Dr. Hutchison gave the Post Induction Prayer after which the right hand of fellowship was extended by members of Presbytery.

Rev. J. R. Waldie of St. Paul's Church, Port Hope, delivered "the charge" to the minister and the people using that part of Christ's own words—"Wist ye not I must be about my Father's business". In part to the minister, Rev. Waldie said, to be about my Father's business, must be a reality, when we see and know God as Father, know Him as my Father. We must realize that God expects us to be up and doing. To the minister he said that at all times to speak in great humility; to study to show himself a workman of the Lord, and at all times to use judgment and common sense.

To the congregation Mr. Waldie said: Your minister is human, he needs your prayers; be faithful in attendance, always ready to encourage and support. Thus both minister and congregation, working together, will perform a great service in the carrying out of "Our Father's Business".

Music throughout the service was provided by Centreville choir with Mrs. Harland Seens, organist and choir directress. The anthem "Take Thy Yoke Upon You" was most fitting. Messrs Fred Wood and Harland Seens sang a duet, "Be Still and Know", very beautifully.

Rev. Gerald Graham pronounced the Benediction.

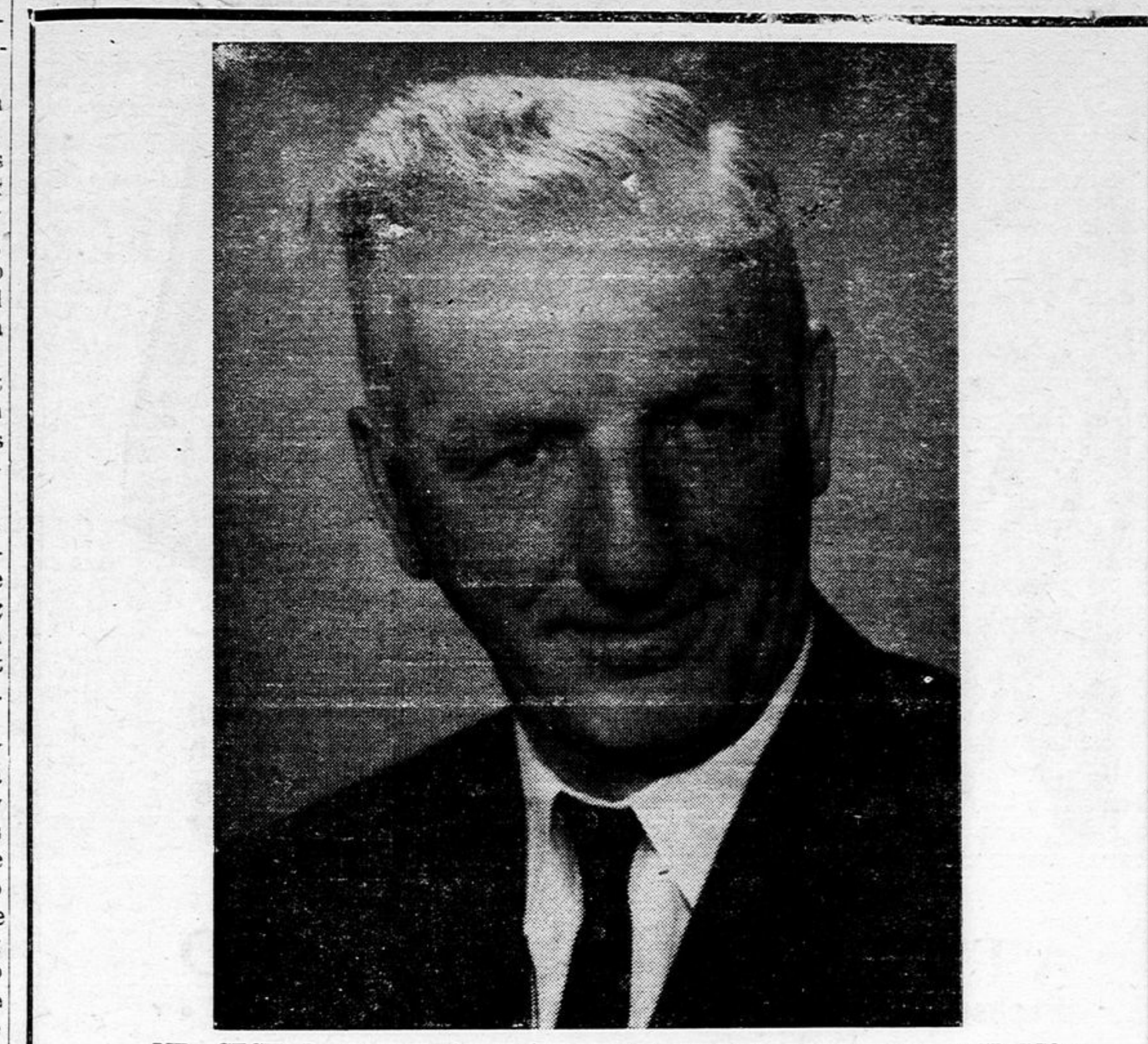
