

Millbrook Village Council

Millbrook, June 1, 1959.—The monthly meeting of the Municipal Council of the Village of Millbrook was held on the above date. Members present as follows:

Reeve—G. F. Harrington.
Councillors—Lavern Gibson, C. E. Thornton, Vincent Crough, Robert Ridge.

Minutes of the last regular meeting, May 4th, and special meeting May 11th were read by the Clerk and were confirmed as read on motion of C. E. Thornton, seconded by Robt. Ridge.

The following communications were read by the Clerk:

From Dept. of Planning and Development, re By-laws repealing or amending restricted area (Zoning) By-laws.

From Pilot Insurance Company, enclosing cheque in the sum of \$58.60 in connection with replacement of bridge or walk at Mrs. West's residence.

From C. A. Holmes, Secretary, Durham and District High School Board, calling for a meeting with Council on Friday, June 12th, 7.30 p.m., in Town Hall, Millbrook. Meeting to be a closed meeting with no newspaper reporters present.

From The Toronto-Dominion Bank, advising that the minimum lending rate covering the Village of Millbrook will be 5 3/4% until further notice.

From R. B. Baxter, Magistrate, reporting on fines for the month of April. Cheque enclosed in the amount of 112.87.

From Ontario Municipal Association and the Town of Timmins advising of Convention to be held in Timmins on June 20th.

From Otonabee Valley Conservation Association outlining the aims of this Association.

From Ontario Water Resources Commission enclosing a report on a sanitary survey of the Village of Millbrook.

From Department of Highways, enclosing an Audit report on the road expenditures for the municipality for the year 1958.

From Department of Highways approving By-law for 1959 road expenditure.

From Northumberland and Durham Health Unit, Certificate of M.O.H. re the Fair-weather Nursing Home.

From Fire Chief Douglas Sheppard, reporting attendance of members of Fire Brigade. All equipment is reported in good condition.

On motion of Councillor V. Crough, seconded by L. Gibson that correspondence be received and filed.

Mrs. Dean Cutmore was present to discuss with Council the building of swimming pool on their property. Council will consider the matter further if Mr. Cutmore will assume all responsibility for the culvert leading from his property.

Mr. and Mrs. William Smilie addressed the Council regarding the disturbance caused every night by cars racing up and down the streets. Council is taking the matter up with the local Police and the Provincial Police.

Mr. Alex Woods presented Council with a petition asking the Reeve and Council to consider the installation of a remote control system so that the fire siren may be sounded from the telephone office by the operator who receives the alarm. This petition was received on motion by Councillor Crough seconded by Councillor Ridge for consideration. Fire Chief Douglas Sheppard was given authority to get all information possible regarding such a system.

Mr. Woods asked the Reeve to explain the forthcoming

water main project with special reference made to the cost of connecting to the main line by property owners. Mr. Harrington outlined the project to him.

Mr. G. T. MacPherson, Toronto, requested the Council to reduce his taxes on his property on the N.S. of King St. This is to be taken before the Court of Revision.

The Reeve made a report that the Public Utilities Commission had been informed that office now located at the Millbrook Electric is to be closed after an audit has been made. The Commission has requested that the Municipal Office be used for billing and secretarial work for the Public Utilities. This request was granted on motion by Councillors Thornton, seconded by Councillor Gibson.

Mr. Steve Burrows of Eastern Steel was present with prices and description of snow plows. This purchase to be decided at a later date.

Mr. Percy Hamilton requested Council to declare, Wednesday, June 10th, a Municipal Holiday, in order that the school children might attend the Agricultural Fair. This request was granted.

The tenders for the town truck and hoist were opened and read. No action was taken.

South Monaghan Council

The regular meeting of the Council of the Township of South Monaghan was held in the Township Hall on June 3rd, 1959, at 8 p.m. with all members present and Reeve George Dean presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and accepted on motion by Robt. Fisher seconded by Herb Syer.

Mr. Thompson, the assistant District Municipal Engineer of the Department of Highways was present at the request of the Reeve and discussed at some length the proposed bridge in front of the R. Cruise property between concession three and four. Concrete and steel were both considered and it was decided to use concrete. Accordingly on motion by Robt. Fisher seconded by A. G. Anderson the Clerk introduced and gave first reading to by-law No. 651 being a supplementary by-law in the amount of \$4000.00 for the

construction of this bridge. Second reading was given on motion by Herb Syer seconded by Jay Whittington. Third and final reading was given on motion by A. G. Anderson seconded by Robt. Fisher. This by-law is subject to approval by the Department of Highways, as they will pay 80 per cent of the cost.

Mr. Finnie of Peterborough interviewed the Council with regard to selling Shell Co. brush spray. After considering all factors the Council made their choice and referred the matter to the Road Superintendent as to date of shipment.

Mr. George Fletcher, the building Inspector presented his monthly report for May and discussed several small matters with Council.

Mr. Mel Heaslip, Chairman of the Public School Area Board and Mr. J. A. Gaynor the Sec. Treas. attended at the request of the Reeve and discussed at some

length the requisition from that body which they were able to reduce in the amount of \$1,500. because of a rearrangement of Department grants.

Mr. Heaslip presented voucher No. 5 in the amount of \$315.65 for road expenditure in the month of May. After due consideration these accounts were passed for payment on motion by Jay Whittington seconded by A. G. Anderson.


