The Ottawa Conference. The late gathering of delegates from the dependencies of Britain in the Southern Seas, to discuss with our Canadian government the question of more extensive trade with the colonies, has finished its labours and many have departed to the homes. It would perhaps be too much to expect the most enthusiastic Colonial Federationist to expect that the mother country would fall in at once with the whole programme discussed and acted upon at that notable meeting—perhaps that a portion of it will meet with unmodified dissent—but yet it can hardly escape the opinion of anyone that the best of results will be the outcome. Without any precedent for calling such a conference—unless the colonial meeting in London a few years ago be called such—without the aid of British Statesmen to preside over and direct the proceedings, without the assistance of aid and prestige of delegates from the motherland—except the tone which the ears open, mouth shut, presence which the Earl of Jersey lent to the proceedings—one of the most notable and particularly satisfactory conferences that could have been wished for, so far as introducing Canada into the Australian colonies is concerned, has come and passed and gone. The day may be far in the distance when the whole mighty empire will be enclosed within a wall—even very low of natural and manufactured product—but the apprehension that that desirable period when the hands of the South Seas together with the Cape will be joint together in one confederation, as our Dominion and the whole dependencies of the crown in Asia, Africa and America have preferential trade amongst themselves, is surely with the reasonable imagination of most of us. Without presuming to discuss the question of Free Trade vs. Protection, we think it will be conceded by those who respect family ties, the brotherly instincts, that the instincts of our own nation, our own kin and kind, should have the preference in trade matters, our return for corresponding privileges accorded to us. Many of us may be willing to admit that in theory, trade has the better side of the argument where the whole globe disposes, throw down their barbed wire fence, but this condition is as yet far from the horizon, and we have to face a condition in practice that forbids the acceptance of all those nice theories that are often forced upon us. That the conference will have, if nothing more, the effect of acquainting our far away brethren with the beauties and capabilities of our Canadian colony, that our people will be induced to study and interest themselves in the welfare and development of those sea-girded islands, is only to be expected. We
