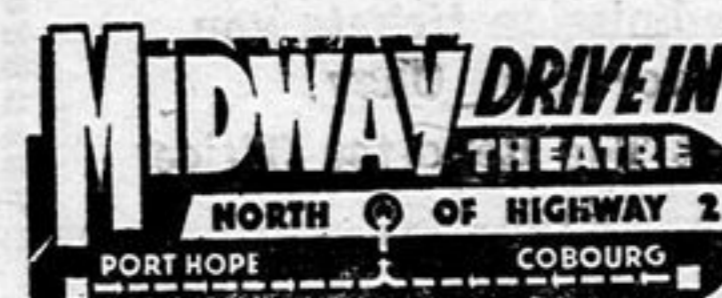
FORMER MEMBER OF CAVAN QUILTING CLUB ATTENDS PICNIC
