Obituary

Mrs. David Fisher.

On Tuesday, July 16, at 5.30 a.m., Mrs. David Fisher passed away in her 86th year at the home of her son, Stanley Fisher, in Hastings. The deceased who had not enjoyed good health for some months, was the former Eliza Jane Russell, daughter of the late William Russell, Jr., and Jane Meharry.

The late Mrs. Fisher was born in Millbrook on February 3, 1872, where she spent most of her life. On November 5th, 1899, she married David Fisher who predeceased her on June 4th, 1907.

All her life Mrs. Fisher had proudly told her relatives that she was the fifth Jane. Her mother was Jane Meharry who was the daughter of Jane Cochrane and Andrew Meharry. Jane Cochrane's mother was Jane Dundas and her mother was Jane Blackstock.

The Meharry family came from Belfast, Ireland, in 1819 and the main characteristic of the family was extreme generosity. One branch of the family spent half of their fortune to found The Meharry Medical College for Coloured People in Nashville, Tennessee. The deceased showed her generosity by never failing in her duty to her family before herself.

The Russell family came from Devonshire, England, in 1831. William Russell, Sr., and William Russell, Jr., the grandfather and father of the deceased settled in Peterborough where the former was killed at Whitlow's race, now known as the locks, Peterborough. Mrs. Fisher, like her father and most of her family, was a staunch conservative and one of her last joys on earth was the Conservative victory on June 10.

Until her death Mrs. Fisher had a keen mind and could recollect the history of her family with many dates and minute details.

In her younger years the deceased had kept a fine flower garden which she loved to look after and it is remembered that when her eyesight began to fail

she could name the flowers by their touch. Rev. F. P. Chisholm in his funeral address stated that Mrs. Fisher had understood the language of the flowers she tended and thereby brought cheer to others.

Mrs. Fisher's devotion for her family will be remembered by all who knew her. She never faltered in her duty to her children and set an excellent example for her contemporaries.

The funeral service was held on Thursday, July 18, at 2:00 p.m. in the J. W. Haw Funeral Home in Millbrook. Rev. F. P. Chisholm officiated.

The pallbearers were grandsons: Russell Fisher, Pontypool; Donald Fisher, Hastings; Edward Collins and Stanley Collins, Peterborough; and grandsons-in-law: Alfred Smith, Ottawa, and Robert Cook, Niagara Falls.

Mrs. Fisher is survived by her five children, Harry Russell Fisher, Pontypool; William Stanley Fisher, Hastings; Mrs. Frank Tickner (Isabelle), Ottawa; Mrs. Charles Collins (Mae), Norwood; and Mrs. Mervin Trick (Jean), Toronto; as well as nineteen grandchildren and twelve great grandchildren.

Deceased was the seventh in a family of nine. The youngest brother, Levi Charles Russell of Cobourg, survives. Brothers and sisters who have died were: Mrs. John Ward, Mrs. Edward McCurry, John James Russell, William Henry Meharry Russell, Mrs. Robert Henderson, Robert Andrew Russell and George Russell.

Relatives came from Ottawa, Hastings, Norwood, Peterborough, Cobourg, Pontypool, Toronto and Niagara Falls.

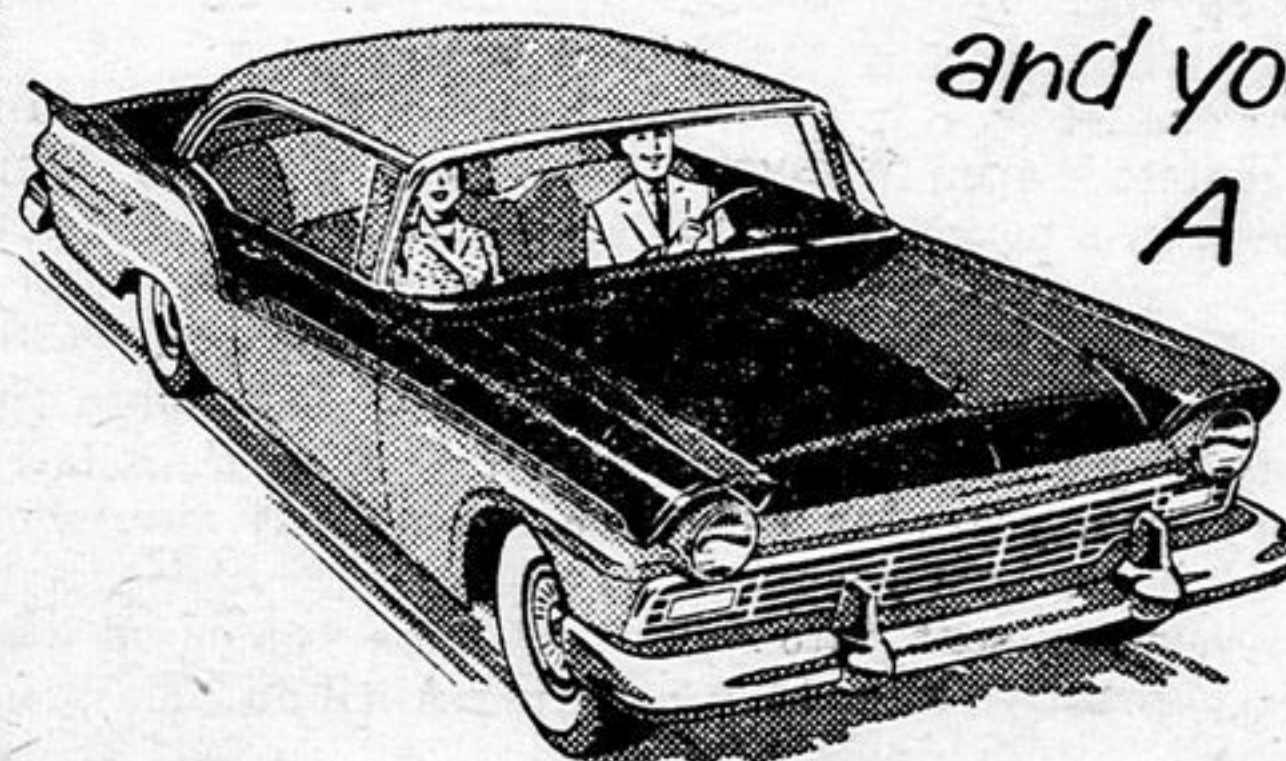

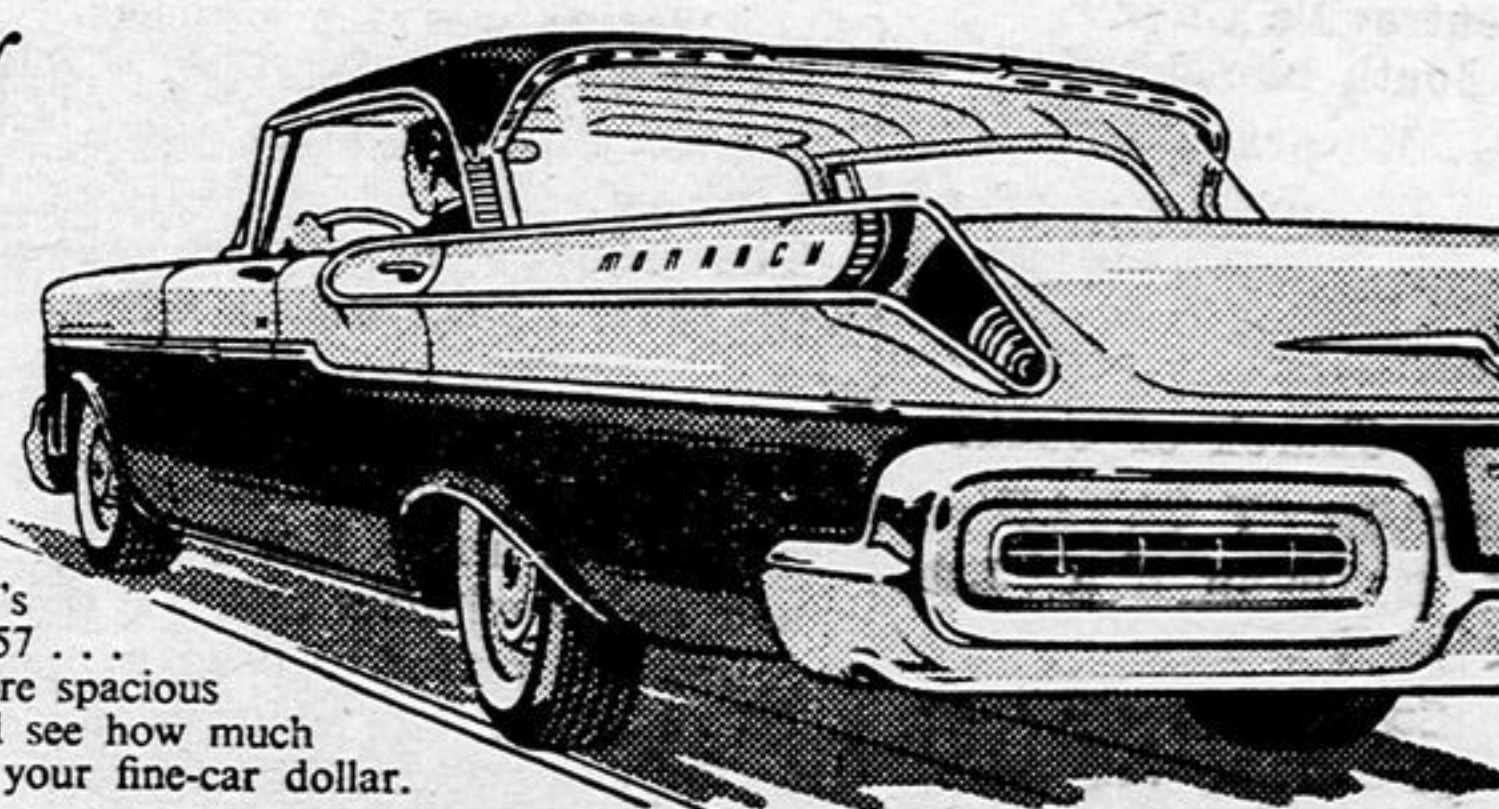
