DURHAM COUNTY DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOL BOARD

The Board met in Port Hope, Thursday evening, July 2nd, 1959, with all members present except two.

Previous to the meeting, plans for a parking lot at Port Hope were discussed on the job. The Port Hope and Hope members were empowered to proceed with the project.

In view of the expected increase at Orono next September in Grade 9, it was decided to commence another Grade 9 room and engage another teacher.

The report of the Consultative Committee to Counties' Council was studied at great length and possible lines of action suggested.

The following resolution was passed 12 for and 2 against— "moved by McGregor and Tamblin that, in view of the urgency regarding accommodation for secondary school students in this district, we write the eight Municipalities informing them that we are adhering to our building programme as presented to them on a letter dated April 2nd, 1959; and ask that the Municipalities who approved the plans at that time to reaffirm their approval, and the Municipalities who did not approve at that time to do so now. The approval asked for tentative approval of three steps—the request to Counties' Council for the issue of debentures, permission for the Board to engage architects, and to acquire school sites. The date of August 1st, 1959 was to be set as a deadline for the receipt of answers. Failing approval by all Municipalities, many of the Board Members expressed the opinion that they would feel that they would have no alternative but to resign. The date of Wednesday, August 5th at Bowmanville is to be set aside for the next meeting of the Board".

ONTARIO HYDRO TO HEAT NEW OFFICES ELECTRICALLY

Electric heating, which has aroused widespread enthusiasm among Ontario home builders, will be built into new Ontario Hydro offices from now on.

Two systems will heat the new Toronto Region building in Willowdale when it is completed next year, it was announced last week.

The main portion of the L-shaped building will use a thermal storage system, in which water conducts the heat. The other wing will have resistance heaters.

All new area offices built by Ontario Hydro will also be heated electrically.

Work is to start this fall on the Toronto Region building on Yonge Street just north of Finch Avenue, and the staff is expected to move into it from the present Bloor Street offices in the late fall of 1960.

Its two stories and basement will have a floor area of 42,000 square feet.

ROSS LUNN, MILLBROOK OFFICER, PROMOTED

The following news item was received last week from the Air Defence Command Headquarters, RCAF Station, St. Hubert, P.Q.

St. Hubert, Que., July 2.—A local RCAF officer, Ross B. Lunn formerly of Millbrook and presently stationed at the RCAF's Air Defence Command Headquarters, St. Hubert, Quebec has been promoted to the rank of Squadron Leader.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. H. J. Lunn of Millbrook, Ontario, Squadron Leader Lunn serves as a Ground Defence Staff Officer with the RCAF.

A graduate of Millbrook High School and Carleton University Squadron Leader Lunn enlisted in the RCAF in April 1942. In February the following year, he graduated as a sergeant pilot.

Following a period of civilian life after the war he re-enlisted in the RCAF in 1950. Subsequently he has served as a staff officer at Air Force Headquarters in Ottawa and as an instructor at Camp Borden, before his posting to Air Defence Command.

Squadron Leader Lunn has also had the unforgettable experience of witnessing atomic weapons tests in South Australia.

He is married to the former Dorothy Louise Sisco of Tavistock, Ontario, who also lived in Millbrook where she attended school during the time her father the Rev. A. L. Sisco was pastor of St. Andrew's Church. The Lunn's have three children, Judith Margaret, Catharine Louise and James Ross.
