ONTARIO HYDRO TO HEAT NEW OFFICES ELECTRICALLY

Electric heating, which has aroused widespread enthusiasm among Ontario home builders, will be built into new Ontario Hydro offices from now on.

Two systems will heat the new Toronto Region building in Willowdale when it is completed next year, it was announced last week.

The main portion of the L. shaped building will use a MONDAY TO thermal storage system, in which water conducts the heat. The other wing will have resistance heaters.

All new area offices built by Ontario Hydro will also be heated electrically.

Work is to start this fall on IN PETERBOROUGH the Toronto Region building on Yonge Street just north of Finch Avenue, and the staff is expected to move into it from the present Bloor Street offices in the late fall of 1960.
