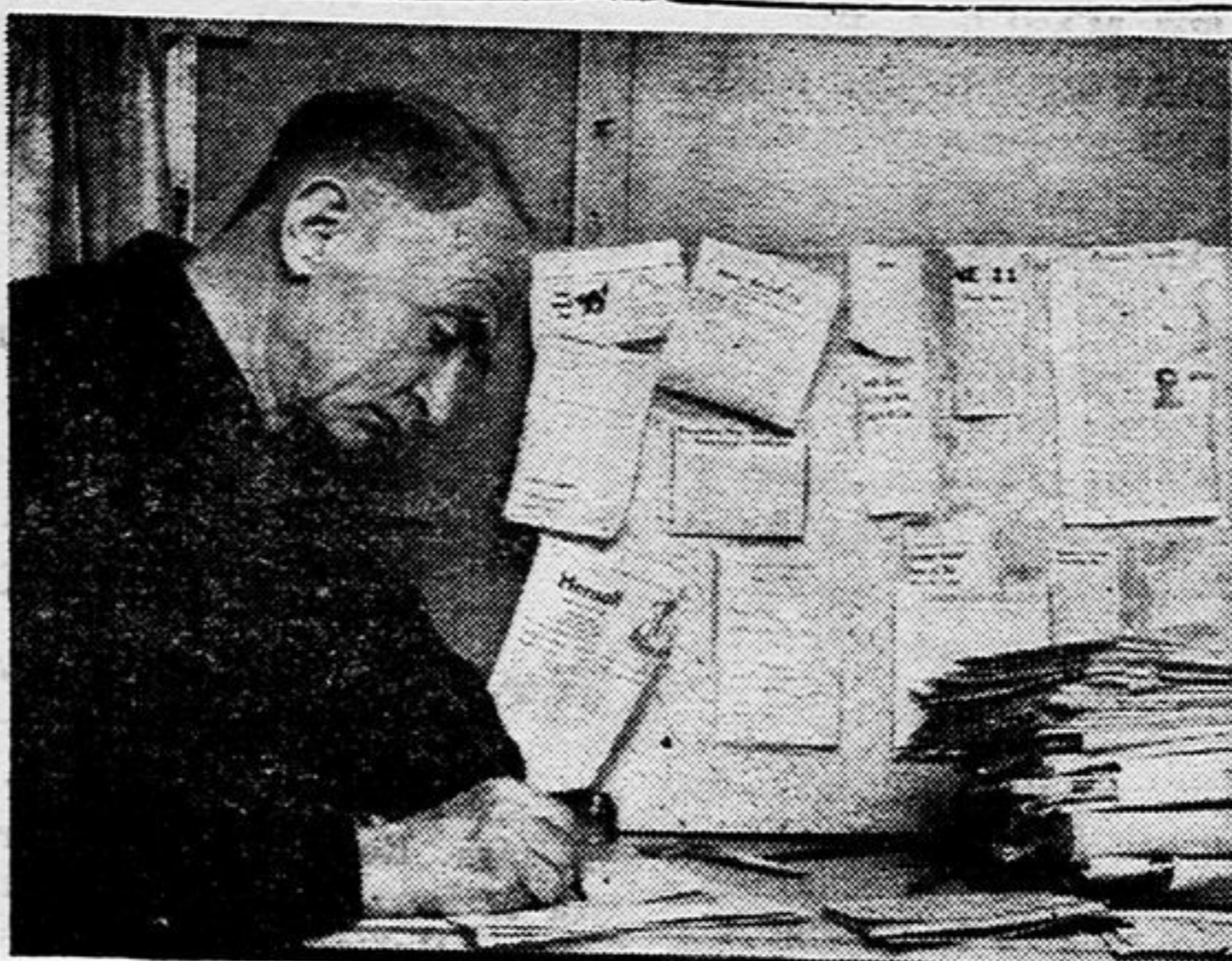


### Sunday Morning At St. Andrew's

July 5th, 1959, Mr. Fred McIndoo, Fairmount, in charge. The carpenter undertook the job, but gave way to the temptation to put inferior material into the house so as to keep extra money for himself. When his employer returned the house was finished and the key handed to the owner, who handed it back to the builder to whom he had decided to give possession of the house. ### DR. STEED GIVES HIS PARTING SERMON AT ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH

"My Ideal Congregation" was the concluding message on Sunday morning, June 28th, of Dr. Steed, based on Scripture Philippians 2:6 and 7.

"As ye have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk ye in Him, rooted and built up in Him, and established in the Faith, as ye have been taught, abounding therein with thanksgiving".

After 52 years in the ministry, from his ordination at the age of 25, he could speak from experience in churches in Canada and Africa on the kind of congregation I would like to serve.

1st. A living congregation—Rev. 3:1 and 2. "I know thy works; that thou hast a name that thou livest, but art dead. Be watchful and strengthen the things that remain, that are ready to die".

2nd. A united congregation,

not necessarily sameness. We appreciate variety in flowers. Certainly "unity of spirit".

3rd. A Missionary congregation, this year we are able to report an increase of \$109.00 in our M. and M. funds. Remember that the Gospel came to us in the Americas through Missionaries from Europe, and Christian pioneers.

4th. A loyal congregation to their church and the minister in charge, who should be consulted, when some family wants the service of a former pastor for a Baptism, marriage, or funeral service. The minister and his family should find true friendship, not jealousy.

5th. A praying congregation. Not seeking a "cheap religion" but as others remembering that the first fruits of the harvest are God's.

6th. An open-minded congregation. God's truth cometh from many sources and will be understood better if we keep our minds open, responding to Truth, like Saul of Tarsus, who was obedient unto the heavenly vision. Acts 9:6 and 15.

7th. A congregation which remembers that the working man has a right to speak the same as any other member of the congregation.

8th. A serving congregation. He who would be greatest must be servant of all, with one purpose and ideal for the welfare of all, in the local church, the community, and the progress of the Kingdom of God, in every area of life.

9th. A witnessing congregation, in word, and in everyday living, winning others to a personal Salvation through Faith in their Saviour Jesus Christ.
