## South Monaghan Council Minutes

The regular meeting of the Council of the Township of South Monaghan was held in the Township Hall on July 6th, at 8 p.m., all members were present with Reeve George Dean presiding.

Minutes of the previous regular and special meetings were read by the Clerk and adopted on motion by Robt. Fisher seconded by Jay Whittington.

Mr. George Fletcher the Building Inspector was present and gave his report for the month of June, and several small matters were discussed.

Tenders had been received at the Clerk's office for construction of a concrete bridge in concession three between lots six and seven. On motion by Herb Syer seconded by A. G. Anderson the Clerk was asked to open and read them. Mr. George Totten the Counties' road engineer was present and discussed the bridge question at some length. After due consideration of all points a motion by Jay Whittington seconded by Robert Fisher, carried that the Council award the contract to the lowest tender of J. A. Poynton Construction Co. as per tendered unit price, the estimated total being \$3,063.00, the Municipality to provide cement, pozzolith, reinforcing steel, approaches, backfill, engineering and miscellaneous at an estimated cost of \$2,450.00.

Mr. George Totten will be the engineer in charge of construction and expects to have the Contractor start immediately.

Mr. Melville Heaslip presented road voucher No. 6 in the amount of \$1,146.77 which after proper inspection by the Council was passed for payment on motion by A. G. Anderson seconded by Herb Syer.

As Mr. Heaslip had served his three month term of probation in charge of the roads the Council agreed to his appointment as Road Superintendent and accordingly on motion by A. G. Anderson seconded by Jay Whittington the Clerk introduced and gave first reading to by-law No. 63. Second reading was given on motion by Herb Syer seconded by Robt. Fisher.

Third and final reading was given on motion by Jay Whittington seconded by R. Fisher thereby appointing Mr. Melville Heaslip as Road Superintendent for the Municipality.

The Clerk presented the following correspondence which had been received:

Dept. of Public Welfare advising of new application form and enclosing a copy of same.

Dept. of Municipal Affairs enclosing valuation notices for two properties within the Township on which the Province will pay a grant in lieu of taxes.

Ontario Hyrd, nine new contracts which were approved.

David Rea of Toronto, enquiring for information for land suitable for reforestation, this will be referred to the Counties' Clerk.

Northumberland and Durham Health Unit, enclosing report for month of May.

Department of Municipal Affairs enclosing statement of and cheque for first instalment of unconditional grant.

Department of Public Welfare enclosing cheque in the amount of \$304.38 which is the

share of moneys for Children's Aid purposes.

Department of Travel and Publicity enclosing copy of The Tourist Establishment Act and information pertaining thereto.
