By-Law No. 851

OF

THE CORPORATION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF MILLBROOK

being a By-Law to authorize the construction of a watermain as a local improvement under the Local Improvement Act, at an estimated cost of \$5,475.00
WHEREAS the Council of the Municipality of Millbrook has by resolution passed by a vote of three-fourths of all members of Council determined and declared that the construction of the watermain listed in schedule "A" to this By-Law should be undertaken as a Local Improvement.
AND WHEREAS the Council has procured to be made the reports, estimates and statements for undertaking the said work.

AND WHEREAS the estimated cost of the work is \$5,475.00.
AND WHEREAS the Ontario Municipal Board by its order dated the day of 1958, has approved of the undertaking of the said work and the passing of all necessary by-laws including debenture by-laws.
AND WHEREAS the Water Resources Commission of the Province of Ontario has approved of the plans and specifications of the watermain as appear from the Certificate of the Water Resources Commission dated the 25th day of June 1958. Certificate No. 58-B-348.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND IT IS HEREBY ENACTED AS A BY-LAW of the Corporation of the Municipality of Millbrook by the Council thereof as follows.

(1) There shall be constructed as a Local improvement under the Local Improvement Act, the watermain listed in Schedule "A" to this by-law at an estimated cost of \$5,475.00.

(2) The Engineer of the Corporation shall forewith make such plans, profiles and specifications and furnish such information as may be necessary for the making of contracts for the construction of the watermain.

(3) The construction of the watermain shall be carried on and executed under the superintendence and according to the directions and orders of the Engineer of the Corporation.

(4) The lands abutting directly upon the said watermain shall be specially assessed with an annual rate of thirty-seven and eight-tenths cents (37.8-10) per foot frontage for a period of fifteen (15) years, subject to the provisions of Section 28 of the Local Improvement Act aforesaid, to pay and in full satisfaction of the owner share of the cost of such a watermain and the interest thereon.

(5) The remainder of the cost of the said watermain together with such portion of the costs as may be deducted from the amounts chargeable to the owners of abutting lands under the provisions of section 28 of the Local Improvement Act aforesaid shall be paid by the Corporation of the Municipality of Millbrook.

(6) Forthwith upon the completion of the said watermain, or as soon as may be practicable thereafter, the Clerk of the Corporation shall prepare special assessment rolls in the manner provided by Section 39 of the Local Improvement Act aforesaid and thereafter the said Clerk shall proceed thereon in the manner provided by the said Act to determine the amounts of the special assessments to be imposed upon the aforesaid lands.

(7) Any person whose lands are specially assessed as aforesaid may commute the special assessments imposed thereon at any time after the special assessment rolls have been certified by the Clerk of the Corporation by paying such sum as, when invested at the rate of interest payable on the debentures which are issued in respect of the cost of the work, will provide an annuity sufficient to pay the remaining instalments of the special assessments as they fall due.

(8) The Corporation of the Municipality of Millbrook may borrow from The Toronto-Dominion Bank, upon the credit of the Corporation at large, by way of temporary advances to meet the expenditures authorized by this by-law, such sum or sums as may be required for that purpose by not exceeding at any one time the total of \$5,475.00 and the Reeve and the Treasurer are hereby authorized to sign and deliver to the said bank such promissory note or notes as may be required from time to time for the payment of the moneys so borrowed at such time or times and at such rate of interest as may be agreed upon with the said bank and to affix to such promissory note or notes the seal of the Corporation of the Municipality of Millbrook.

(9) In respect of the temporary advances authorized by this by-

law the Reeve and Treasurer are hereby authorized to hypothecate to The Toronto-Dominion Bank, as collateral, security for any sum or sums borrowed from the said Bank and interest thereon, any debentures which may be issued to defray the cost of the work undertaken under this by-law and the proceeds of the sale of the said debentures, or as much thereof as may be necessary, shall be paid to the said Bank in satisfaction of the sum or sums so borrowed and interest thereon.
