

Millbrook Village Council Minutes

The regular meeting of the Municipal Council of the Village of Millbrook was held on the above date. Members present as follows: Reeve George F. Harrington, Councillors—Lavern Gibson, C. E. Thornton, Vincent Crough, Robert Ridge. The minutes of the last regu-

lar meeting were read by the Clerk and on motion of R. Ridge, seconded by L. Gibson were adopted as read.

The minutes of the special meeting of the Town Hall Committee were read. This meeting was held to consider a heating system for the Town Hall. The Town Hall Committee presented to Council a recommendation that tender be given to G. H. Hutchinson & Son for an oil burner to heat the concert hall, council chamber and two offices. On motion by Robert Ridge, seconded by E. Thornton, re the heating that Millbrook Council accept the recommendation forwarded by the Town Hall Committee regarding the furnace. Details in recommendation. Carried.

J. Van de Bor was present and requested by Council to put the sidewalk just constructed by him on Tupper Street in good shape, that is, to straighten the sides. This work to be done within the week.

Mr. K. Toms presented Council with a plot plan for subdivision. The plan was accepted by Council and is to be forwarded to the Planning and Development Board for their approval. This was accepted on motion by L. Gibson seconded by Robert Ridge.

Vincent Crough, seconded by R. Ridge, the Reeve and Clerk were authorized to sign the resolution and forward it to the Durham County District High School Board. The resolution reads as follows: Whereas the Board of Trustees of the Durham County District has applied to the Municipal Councils having jurisdiction in the said District for the issue of debentures in an amount estimated to be \$700,000 repayable over a period of twenty years, to provide for the cost of construction of a 400 pupil school in Darlington and a 150 pupil school in Millbrook. Be it resolved that the Council of the Corporation of the Village Millbrook being a municipality included in the said District, hereby approves the said application and agrees to assume its proper proportion of the amounts required to pay for the said debentures interest thereon and the expenses connected therewith, to be determined from time to time in the manner provided by the Secondary School Act. Be it further resolved that the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Millbrook hereby requests the Council of the Corporation of the United Counties of Northumberland and Durham to raise the entire estimated sum of \$700,000. required for the purposes aforesaid by the issue of debentures of the Corporation of the United Counties of Northumberland and Durham.

From—The City of Barrie asking us to accept a resolution re brakes on trucks and buses, that is, all trucks or busses over 4 tons be equipped with brakes having at least two means of application. Moved by L. Gibson, seconded by E. Thornton that we adopt this resolution.

From—The Northumberland and Durham Health Unit giving their report for the previous month.

THE WEED CONTROL ACT SAYS:

Clause 5: Every occupant of land, or if the land is unoccupied, the owner shall destroy all weeds designed noxious by the regulations as often in every year as is sufficient to prevent the ripening of their seeds:

Clause 23: Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Act or refuses to obey any lawful order of an Inspector, given under authority of this Act, shall incur a penalty of not less than \$10.00, nor more than \$50.00 for every such offence.
