

**Manvers Twp. Council**

Bethany, Ont., Aug. 4th, 1959.—The regular monthly meeting of the Municipal Council of the Township of Manvers, was held on the above date with all members present and the Reeve presided.

The minutes of the July meeting were read and approved on motion of Jakeman and Brown. Carried.

The following communications were received and read: Dominion Road Machinery, re notice of credit of account. Municipality of Millbrook, re notice of three indigent patients at Nursing Home and new system of making payment. Dept. of Highways, re acknowledging receipt of signed agreement, pertaining to Township shed lot frontage. City of Barrie, re resolution. Dept. of Agriculture, re Warble grant for \$419.78. N. and D. Health Unit monthly report. Three sheep claims and several accounts.

Mr. Ernest Colley, a summer resident at Viewlake called on the Council to express his appreciation on the behalf of the

'Cottagers' for the improved condition of the road along the Lake.

Moved by McGill, seconded by Malcolm that the Resolution of the City of Barrie, calling for brakes on vehicles of four tons or over to have an extra method of applying in an emergency was endorsed. Carried.

Moved by Malcolm, seconded by Brown that the Clerk write the Dept. of Highways at Port Hope regarding the poor job of re-surfacing the main Street in Pontypool and that the Council are of the opinion that the job should be re-done. Carried.

On motion of Malcolm and Brown the Clerk was instructed to contact the Municipal Engineer to discuss the financial arrangements necessary in order to purchase a new 4-wheel drive truck for snow plowing purposes. Carried.

A delegation from Pontypool called on the Council to voice their disapproval in regard to the re-surfacing of the main street in Pontypool. It was felt that the job performed by

the Dept. of highways was not up to the usual high standard. The Reeve informed the delegation that the Council were not satisfied with the job and had passed a motion to try and have the situation corrected.

Moved by Jakeman, seconded by McGill that the Clerk introduce the By-law dealing with the Township rates for 1959 taxation. Carried.

By-law No. 1360 was given the three necessary readings, signed, sealed and numbered. The Commercial rate for 1959 was set at 34 mills on the dollar and the resident and farm rate 31 mills on the dollar.

Moved by McGill, seconded by Malcolm that the Clerk introduce the By-law dealing with the Public School rates for 1959. Carried.

By-law No. 1361 was given the three necessary readings, signed, sealed, numbered and duly passed; setting the mill rates for the various School Sections for 1959.

**Obituary**

**Henry C. Attwooll**

The death occurred on Tuesday, August 4th, 1959, in Peterborough Civic Hospital, of Henry Charles Attwooll of this village. Mr. Attwooll was 90 years of age. He had lived in Millbrook where with his nephew, Mr. Douglas Sheppard, he operated the grist and lumber mill from which the village gets its name, for 49 years.

He was born in Wiltshire, England, the son of the late William Attwooll and the former Maria Shepherd. When he came to Canada 52 years ago he lived in Primrose, Ontario, for the first three years, where he operated a mill with his uncle, George Shepherd. He moved to Millbrook from Primrose.

Mr. Attwooll was ill only since the Sunday previous to his death, although he had been failing for some time before that. Until after his 90th birthday he still went regularly to work in the mill.

He is survived by his wife the former Mary Ann Whitmarsh and two daughters, Mrs. Howard Lancashire (Ada) of Millbrook, and Miss Mae Attwooll of Peterborough. Two brothers and a sister predeceased him.

Mr. Attwooll was a member of St. Thomas' Anglican Church. The funeral service was held Thursday, at 2 p.m. from his late residence, Prince Street. The Rev. Gerald E. Graham of Grace Presbyterian Church conducting the service due to Rev. Mr. Palfrey of St. Thomas' Church being on his holidays.

Interment was in St. Paul's Cemetery, Cavan Township.

The death occurred on Monday, August 3rd, 1959, in Civic Hospital, Peterborough, after a short illness, of Mrs. Harry E. Ellis, of Millbrook. Mrs. Ellis was born Janet Wilson in Tottenham, the daughter of the late John Wilson and the former Janet Semple. Her husband, Dr. Harry E. Ellis, predeceased her in 1955.

Mrs. Ellis moved to Millbrook with her husband 41 years ago, at the time of their marriage. Before that she lived in Burks Falls. She was the last surviving member of her family. Relatives surviving are a nephew, the Rev. Nacklem Brett, rector of Grace Church, Sutton, Que., and a brother-in-law, the R. H. Brett, of Granby, Quebec.

A member of Grace Presbyterian Church, Mrs. Ellis served there a number of years ago as treasurer of the W.M.S. She was also a member of the Ladies' Aid.

The funeral took place from Grace Presbyterian Church on Wednesday afternoon, August 5th. The Rev. Gerald E. Graham officiating. Interment was in Mount Taggart Cemetery, Tottenham, Ontario.

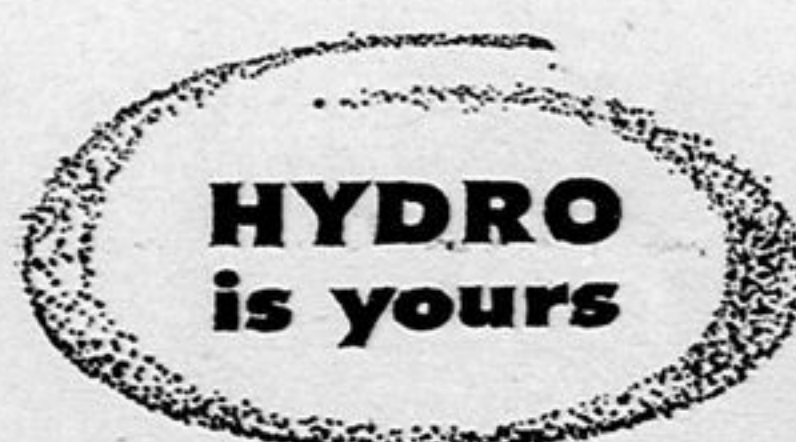
