Miss Elinore Crowley of Peterboro, formerly of Millbrook, will be among the 2000 young people who participate in the North American Ecumenical Youth Assembly on the campus of the University of Michigan August 16 to 23. The Assembly is a gathering of young Christian leaders from 40 different communions, predominantly Protestants and Orthodox, in Canada and the United States.

Sponsors of the event are the youth departments of the World Council of Churches and of the World Council of Christian Education, the Committee on Young People's Work of the Canadian Council of Churches, and the United Christian Youth Movement of the National Council of Churches of Christ in the U.S.A.

About 200 of the young people will be from overseas.

The bride wore an afternoon dress of blue lace over taffeta with white headdress and short circular veil of nylon net. Her corsage was of red roses.

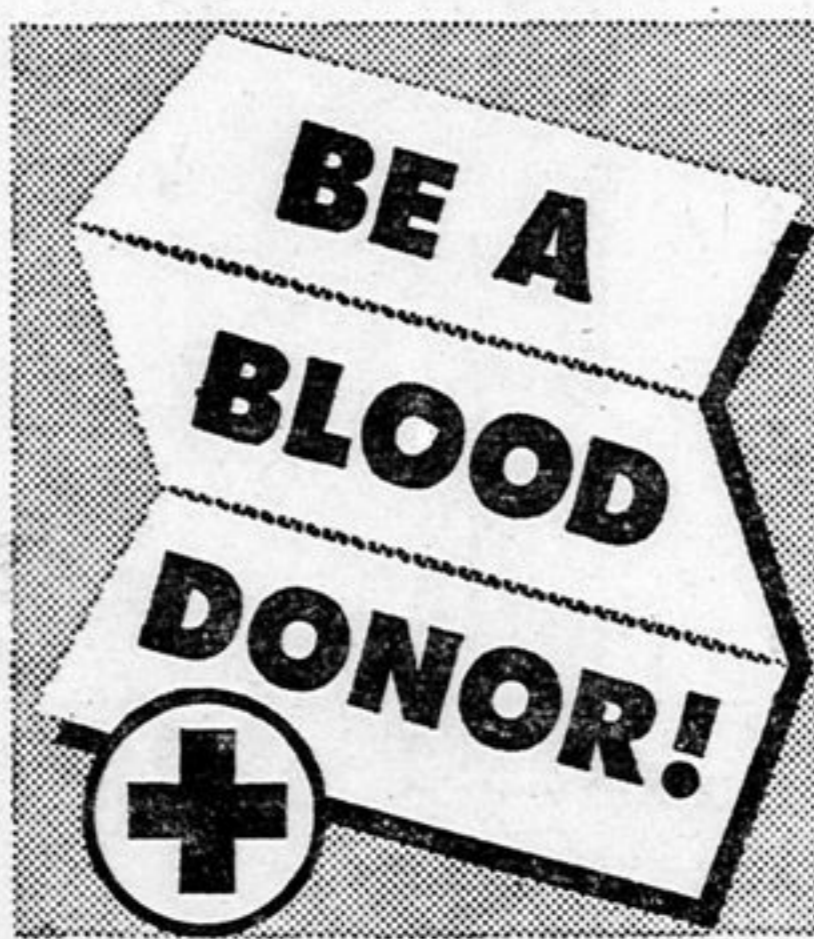
