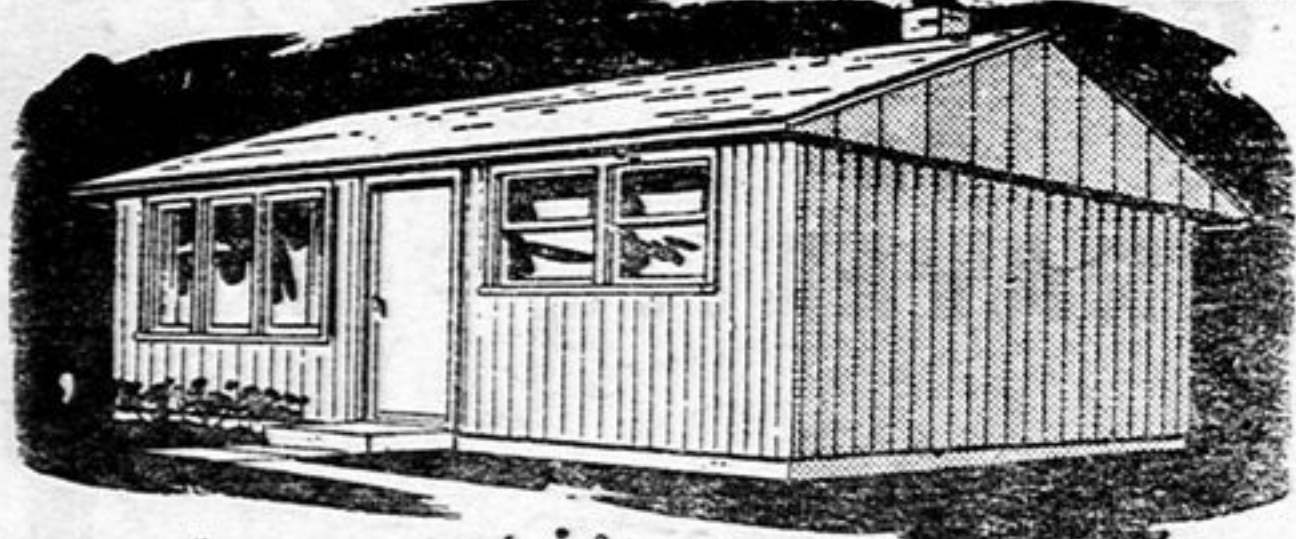

Mr. and Mrs. Campbell Observe Their Fiftieth Anniversary

Exactly fifty years ago last Wednesday, September 4th, young Thomas A. Campbell married Belvie Martin, daughter of an Alaska doctor, in Seattle, Washington. That day the couple were at home to their friends in Millbrook during the afternoon and from 7.30 to 9.30 in the evening.

Both were members of prominent, and widely separated families. The village of Campbellcroft, Ontario, was named after the Campbell family and George Campbell, Thomas' father, was a member of the provincial parliament. George and his wife, the former Margaret Walsh, moved to their farm on the Fourth Line of Cavan when Thomas was born.

Belvie Martin's father, Dr. S. J. Martin was well known in the mining camps of Alaska, where he practised following the gold discoveries of '97. He and his wife, the former Alexander, were spending a year in Seattle when their daughter was married.

How did these young people, living so far apart, come to meet? A simple family visit. Belvie was attending boarding school in Boston and went up to Millbrook to see her aunt, the late Mrs. John Allen. In the course of it she met Thomas Campbell and the upshot was the wedding at the home of her parents.

Groomsman at the ceremony held on a Wednesday in Trinity Anglican Church, Seattle, was Thomas' brother Arthur, while the bridesmaid was Miss Sarah Livingstone, grandniece of African missionary David Livingstone.

After the wedding, the couple lived for several years at the Campbell's Cavan home and another six years in Millbrook. They spent twenty years in different parts of British Columbia and Alberta where Thomas, a machinist, made mine machinery. A skilled woodworker, he also built houses in Vancouver.

They returned to Millbrook twenty-two years ago, the idea being that Thomas should retire. He has been busy ever since, however, with cabinet-making and repairing farm machinery. Among his products is the lectern of Millbrook United Church. He is also chairman of the St. Paul's Cemetery Board and led the campaign for renovation of the chapel and grounds, completed this year. Mr. Campbell is a life member of the Millbrook Masonic Lodge.

Both he and his wife are prominent in the Red Cross. Mr. Campbell being chairman of the campaign committee and Mrs. Campbell in charge of the work program. Mrs. Campbell is also on the Council Guild of St. Thomas' Anglican Church, its Women's Guild and the W.A.—Peterboro' Examiner.
