St. Andrew's United Church is preparing to celebrate its 75th Anniversary on Sunday, October 20th, 1957, with services morning and evening, with Rev. C. E. Cragg, Toronto, as guest speaker.

Holidays are over, our Pastor Rev. Francis Chisholm was on full duty on Sunday morning, September 22nd with a challenging message from the text Matt. 5:13, "Ye are the salt of the earth; but if the salt have lost his savour, wherewith shall it be salted?" It is henceforth good for nothing, but to be cast out, and to be trodden under foot of men". These are the words of Jesus Christ, in His sermon on the mount, as recorded in Matthew, chapters 5, 6 and 7.

"Not worth his salt." Does it apply to you? In Palestine, and to His twelve disciples most of whom were fishermen on the Sea of Galilee, salt was an absolute necessity of preserving foodstuffs, and preventing decay and corruption. As professing Christians, we should act through dedicated lives, as a saving quality in our present day world.

1st. Salt as a preserving power—To accomplish its benefits salt must come in close contact.

A Christian cannot withdraw himself in a convent or monastery, if he is to be used to keep his community pure and fresh and wholesome. Without the salt of such dedicated lives, what would a community be

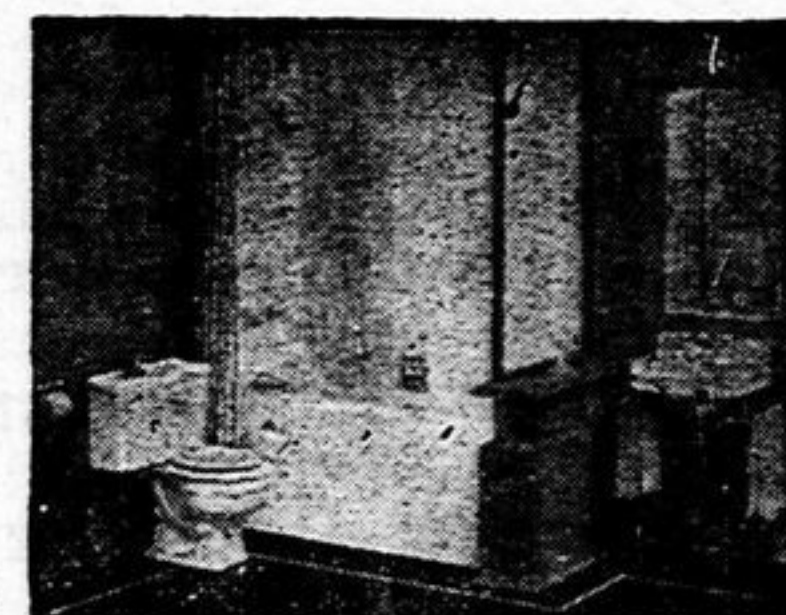
