

# SCHOOL SITUATION

The assembly room at the Millbrook School was packed Monday night for a meeting of the Home and School Association called to discuss the future of the Millbrook High School and the possibility of a new High School being built in or near the village.

The Durham County District High School Board was present as guests of the meeting. Prominent in the background of the meeting was the recent refusal by the Millbrook Council to approve district high school board debentures for building a 300-pupil school at Orono.

Of the eight municipalities in the district only Port Hope, Hope Township and Clarke Township have approved the Orono site.

With approval of five councils required before further steps can be taken, Millbrook's veto, added to those of Newcastle, Darlington Township and Bowmanville, put the board back where it was nearly a year ago when it began to investigate possible sites for a much needed new school to relieve growing congestion at Bowmanville.

Cavan Township has not yet voted on the issue but Reeve L. Hooton said at Monday night's meeting Cavan would probably follow Millbrook whichever way it went.

The southern part of Cavan is in the Durham area while the north of the Township is in the Peterborough suburban area.

Primarily an issue among Millbrook residents is their desire to keep a High School in the village. The school is at present renting space from the Public School Board, but predictions for future elementary school population indicates there will be no room for high school students in the near future. Even now some public school classes are being held in the War Vets Hall.

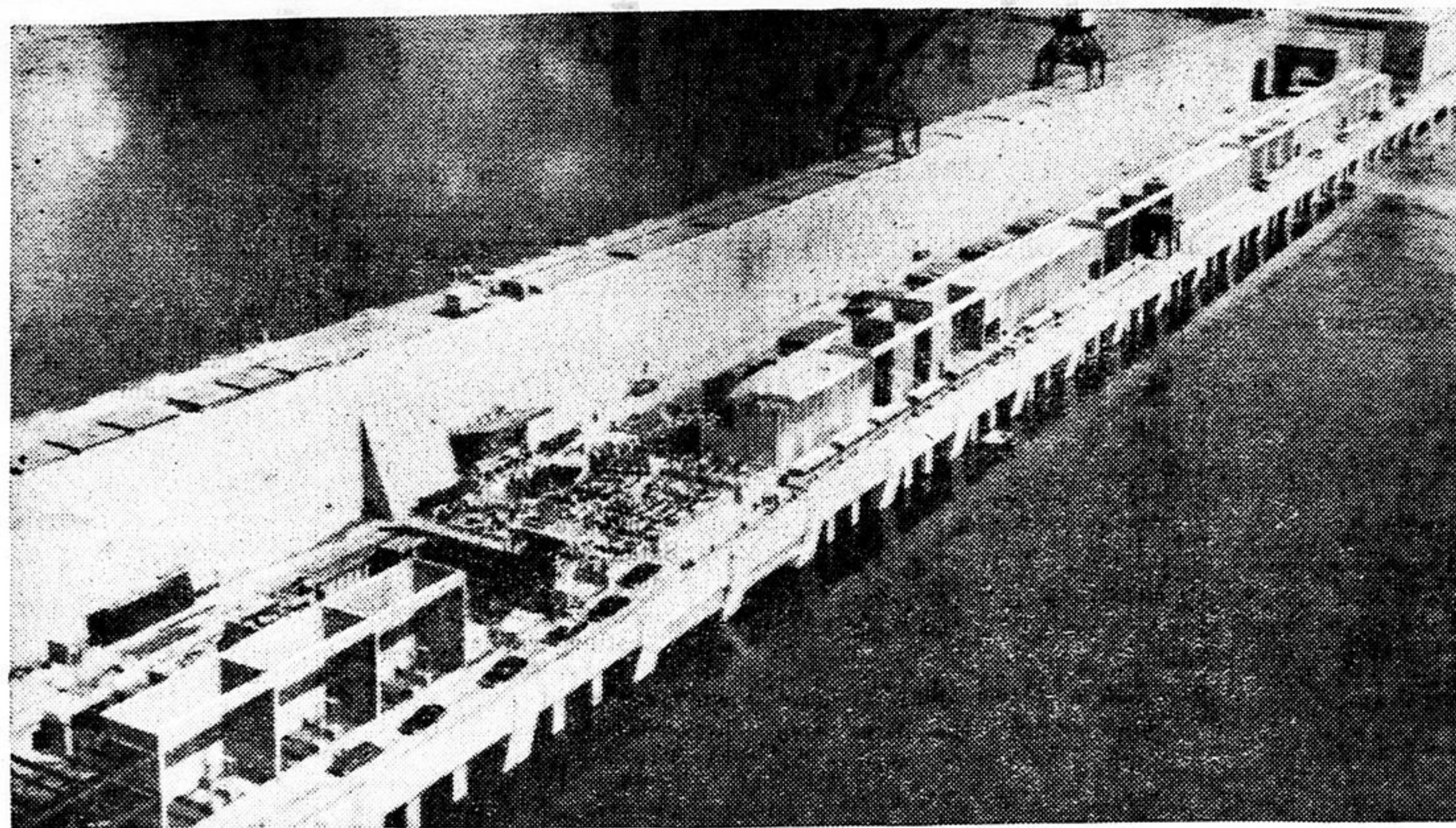
Faced with this problem Millbrook parents, anxious to avoid sending their children long distances on a bus to high school, hope a new school can be built in Millbrook.

Reg. Hopkins, a member of the Millbrook Public School Board and chairman of a special committee appointed by the Home and School Association, reported that in a survey taken in an area within eight miles of Millbrook, 62.1 per cent of those polled said they would prefer to send their children to a new modern High School at Millbrook.

No answer was received from 18.3 per cent and 19.6 per cent were satisfied with the education their children were getting elsewhere.

Answers favouring a new school at Millbrook came from north Cavan, north Hope, Manvers and South Monaghan Townships, Mr. Hopkins said.

If Millbrook people could persuade enough residents of other areas to break from their present area and join Durham so that the potential high

At present, the board can do nothing, he said.

Reeve G. F. Harrington of Millbrook said his council voted against the new high school at Orono in the belief they were supported by public

opinion in the village but they would rescind their decision and vote in favor if the parents of school children wanted them to.—Examiner.

## Manvers Council

Bethany, Ont., Sept. 11, 1958.—The regular meeting of the Manvers Council was held at the Manvers Municipal Office, with all of the Council present. Reeve acted as chairman.

The minutes of the meeting were read and approved on motion of Br. McGill. Carried.

The following resolutions were received: Sanitation Equipment. Information regarding building permits; F. L. request to contribute to the fee for High School; Two applications for rural Hydro service; Road Machinery. Notice of delivery of one sheep claim and accounts.

Two cottage owners, Viewlake, interviewed regarding the problem in repairing the cottage. Also asked that Lots 1 and 2, Plan No. 46 be dealt in the manner of weed spraying.

A delegation of the form S.S. Nos. 14 interviewed the Council regarding the matter of the new attending Millbrook Orono High School. Victoria County D. H. Board reimbursing the County High School for their tuition and transfer fees.

Moved by Jakeman, seconded by Malcolm, that the Municipal Council make a request to the County High School Board to give consideration to appeal of ratepayers' School Sections No. 14 Township of Manvers as the said ratepayers requested the Victoria A.B. to pay the transportation of 7 pending Millbrook and High Schools, to the County H. School Board because of the close proximity of the said schools; and it is the opinion of this Council that the payment of fees is the most practical solution to the problem.

A delegation of ratepayers in the Janetville area of the Council to make a request to the County H. School Board as to whether a road between the properties of Leslie and Arthur Hill, the Village of Janetville Municipal Street or a lane.

Moved by McGill, seconded by Brown, that the Council ascertain as to whether said roadway in the Janetville area was a street registered plan of the Village of Janetville or private property. Also to find out the width of the street in the event the roadway should be widened and the description of property owned by Arthur Hill in the Village of Janetville. Carried.
