# Manvers Twp Council

Bethany, Ont., Sept. 2nd, 1958.—The regular monthly meeting of the Manvers Municipal Council was held on the above date, with all members of the Council present and the Reeve acted as chairman.

The minutes of the August meeting were read and approved on motion of Brown and McGill. Carried.

The following communications were received and read: Sanitation Equipment Limited, re information regarding plumbing permits; F. L. Weldon, request to contribute to Lawyer's fee re High School Appeal; Two applications for rural Hydro service; Dominion Road Machinery Co., official notice of delivery of grader; One sheep claim and several accounts.

Two cottage owners from Viewlake interviewed Council regarding the progress being made in repairing the road serving the cottage area and also asked that Lots 1 and 2 in Plan No. 46 be developed in the manner of weed and brush spraying.

A delegation of ratepayers from S.S. Nos. 14 and 19 interviewed the Council regarding the matter of their children attending Millbrook and Orono High Schools and the Victoria County D. High School Board reimbursing the Durham County High School Board for their tuition and transportation fees.

Moved by Jakeman, seconded by Malcolm, that Manvers Municipal Council make a formal request to the Victoria County High School Area Board to give consideration to the appeal of ratepayers from School Sections No. 14 and 19, Township of Manvers: Whereas the said ratepayers have requested the Victoria C.H.S. A.B. to pay the tuition and transportation of 7 pupils attending Millbrook and Orono High Schools, to the Durham County H. School Board, because of the close proximity of the said schools; and Whereas it is the opinion of this Council that the payment of the said fees is the most practical solution to the problem. Carried.

A delegation of ratepayers in the Janetville area called on the Council to make inquiry as to whether a roadway between the properties of Wilfrid Leslie and Arthur Hannah in the Village of Janetville was a Municipal Street or a private lane.

Moved by McGill, seconded by Brown, that the Clerk contact the registry office and ascertain as to whether the said roadway in the Village of Janetville was a street in the registered plan of Village of Janetville or private property. Also to find out the width of the street in the event that the roadway should be a street and the description of the property owned by Arthur Hannah in the Village of Janetville. Carried.

A discussion took place in connection with Township Tax Arrears. Each year during the last 5 years the tax arrears have been increasing in greater proportion than the tax roll and unless this situation is corrected the Township is going

to have too much credit (tax arrears) on its books.  
Moved by Malcolm, seconded by Brown that the penalty for unpaid taxes effective December 15th, be increased from 2 to 3% and to be effective Dec. 15th, 1958 and thereafter. Carried.  
Moved by Malcolm, seconded by Brown, that Township of Manvers apply to the Dept. of Highways for the interim road subsidy up to August 31, 1958. Carried.
