The Rev. George A. Boyle, B.A., professor in Emmanuel College, Toronto, was guest speaker.

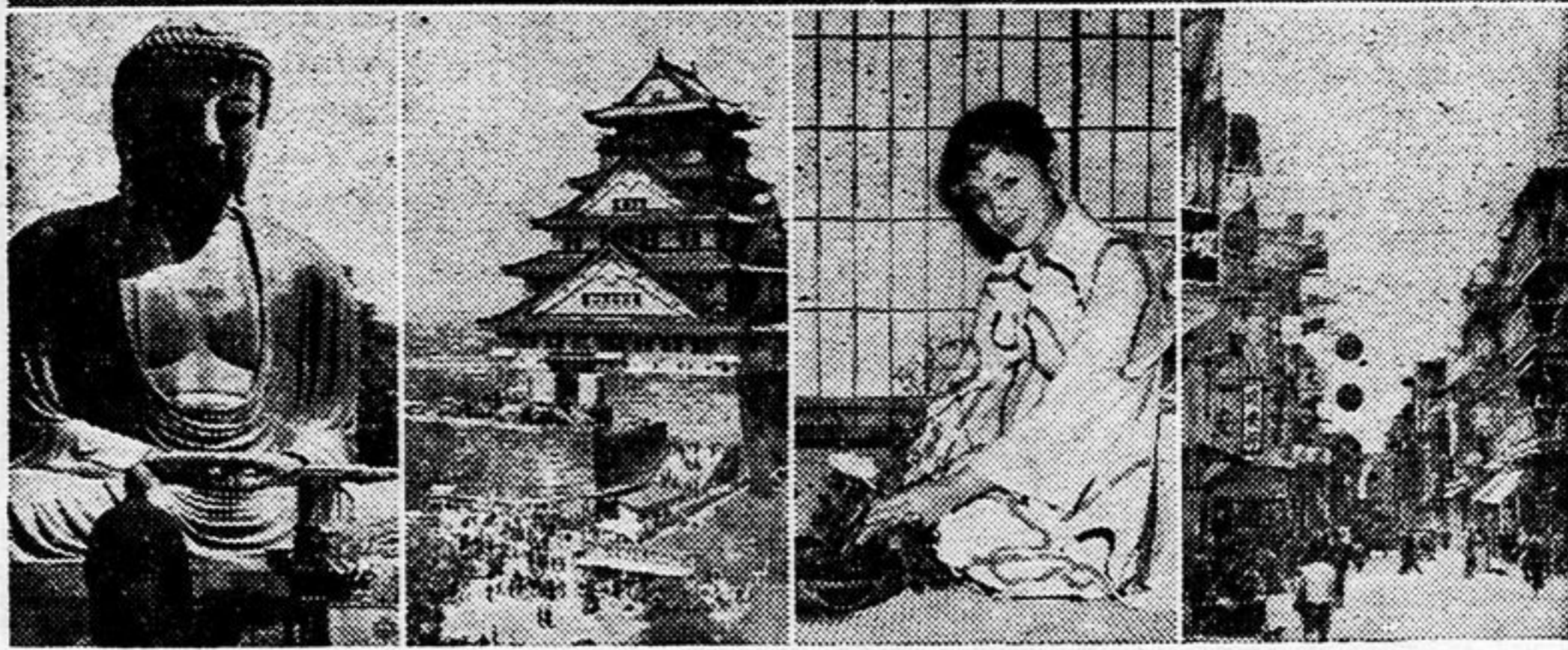

ANOTHER FIRST FOR CANADIAN PACIFIC

First trans-pacific jet-prop service from North America to the Orient was inaugurated by Canadian Pacific Airlines last month. Canadian Pacific's 400-mile-an-hour, 100-passenger Bristol Britannia jet-prop begins twice-weekly service between Vancouver and Tokyo, August 24th. With its ability to cruise up to 5,000 miles without refuelling, this "long-winded" jet-era transport is ideally matched against

the long-stage route pattern of C.P.A. Flying time to Tokyo will be 12 to 13 hours as the aircraft cruises in the smooth sub-stratosphere six miles above the earth. On arrival, C.P.A. aims to ensure that Canadians become intimately acquainted with the Orient. Vacationers taking advantage of Canadian Pacific's 28-day "magic carpet" tours through Japan, Hong Kong, Manila, Bangkok, and Honolulu will see such exotic sights as the gigantic

bronze Buddha at Kamakura, Japan, built in 1252, (lower left); with the Osaka Castle, one of Japan's most beautiful feudal structures (next to the Buddha); flower arranging, an ancient and skilled art, demonstrated here by a modern Japanese maiden; and (right lower corner) is Hong Kong. Uninhabited only 100 years ago, Hong Kong is a shopper's paradise. Today this "free port" offers duty-free goods from the markets of the world.

NOTICE TO TOWNSHIPS OF CAVAN, MANVERS AND SOUTH MONAGHAN

THE WEED CONTROL ACT SAYS:

Clause 5: Every occupant of land, or if the land is unoccupied, the owner shall destroy all weeds designed noxious by the regulations as often in every year as is sufficient to prevent the ripening of their seeds.

Clause 23: Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Act or refuses to obey any lawful order of an Inspector, given under authority of this Act, shall incur a penalty of not less than \$10.00, nor more than \$50.00 for every such offence.

140 Laymen Attend Bay Of Quinte Conferen

"Fulfil Your Ministry" the theme for 140 laymen attending the third Annual of Quinte Men's Conference held at Belleville's Albert College last week-end. Through a fast three-day program the theme challenged from over forty communities Eastern Ontario.

Dr. J. R. Mutchmor, Secretary of Evangelism and Service, complimented the laymen on the effectiveness of their work, plans and program in re-vitalizing the role of the total program of Church.

Dealing with the subject "Moral Issues", Dr. Mutchmor said, "when it comes to a major moral issue when we (United Church) have convictions and others will not, announce their convictions must say we will go on. But, we should not be blasphemous nor dogmatic. For example, said Dr. Mutchmor, the United Church taken an official position "uncompromising opposition to the liquor trade".

Dr. Mutchmor answered temporarily questions dealing with subjects ranging from nuclear war to total abstinence, settlement of the present beer strike to obscene literature.

"Fifteen million adults live to read every year—but what do they read? When did you last read a book on religion?" said Morrison Kelly, Professor of Public Worship, Emmanuel College, Toronto. "We are faced with people who appear to have never graduated from the Sunday School—people who have to learn to grow up in understanding Christ. A peculiar question seems to be—little can a man believe still be a Christian!"

Drawing on a new testament figure, Dr. Kelly said, "we have (Ephraim) a completely dedicated servant of a model of devotion. A faith which has been authentically and personally obtained not a series of hand me downs—can enable us to "fulfil ministry" as this man did. The conference was opened by Sid Martin, Frank Planning Committee Chairman. Greetings were brought by A. E. McKenzie, Principal, Judge J. D. Anderson, Chairman of the Board of Governors at Albert College; Rev. J. Lane, President, Bay of Quinte Conference.

"The spirit of this conference is equal to any (in Canada) said Ralph Wilson, Assistant Secretary, The Board of Ministers. "and there is a new vitality coming into the Church through the enthusiasm, interest and concern of 34,000 Churchmen in 806 men's clubs." Work, retreat and renewal challenge and a call to effective Christian service. Mr. Wilson, is needed in Church and in the world where we live and work. We should be constantly evaluating our program to measure its effectiveness.

Fred McIndoo, Conference Mens' Council President, presided during a review of minutes.
