**WILLIAM H. CROCKER**

The funeral service for William H. Crocker, who was born, and lived all his life, on a farm on the 2nd Concession of Manvers Township, was held Tuesday, August 22. Interment was in St. John's Cemetery, Ida.

The Rev. R. C. Rose, Bethany, conducted the service. Robert Sisson was at the organ. Among the hymns was Mr. Crocker's favorite, "O, Master, Let Me Walk With Thee."

Mr. Crocker was in his 80th year. He had been ill only a few days. He was a lifelong member of Trinity-the-Marsh Anglican Church, where he served a number of years as Ward-en.

He was the son of William Henry Crocker, Sr., and Jane Widdis. His wife, the former Margaret Maria Porter died in 1947, his only brother in 1881.
