## OBITUARY

### JAMES ARMSTRONG

James Delbert Armstrong, 55, of 55 Cameron St., Peterboro, died in hospital in Peterboro on Tuesday, September 4, 1962 after undergoing a heart operation in Montreal eleven weeks ago. He had suffered a lengthy illness prior to the operation.

He was born in Cavan Township to the late George Armstrong and Mary Kennedy. Except for 12 years in Belleville and 8 years running a store in Mount Pleasant, he had spent most of his life in Peterboro. For 19 years he was in the carpenters shop at CGE.

He was a member of Grace United Church and Lorne Lodge 375, Omemece.

Surviving are his wife, the former Helen Margaret Huggins; daughter Letta, Mrs. Ted Cummings, and son Alvin Armstrong, both of Peterboro; a sister, Viola, Mrs. Harold Little of Millbrook, and a brother Wesley of Welcome; and four grand children.

The service was on Friday the Rev. J.B. Spencley officiating. A Masonic service was held the previous evening.

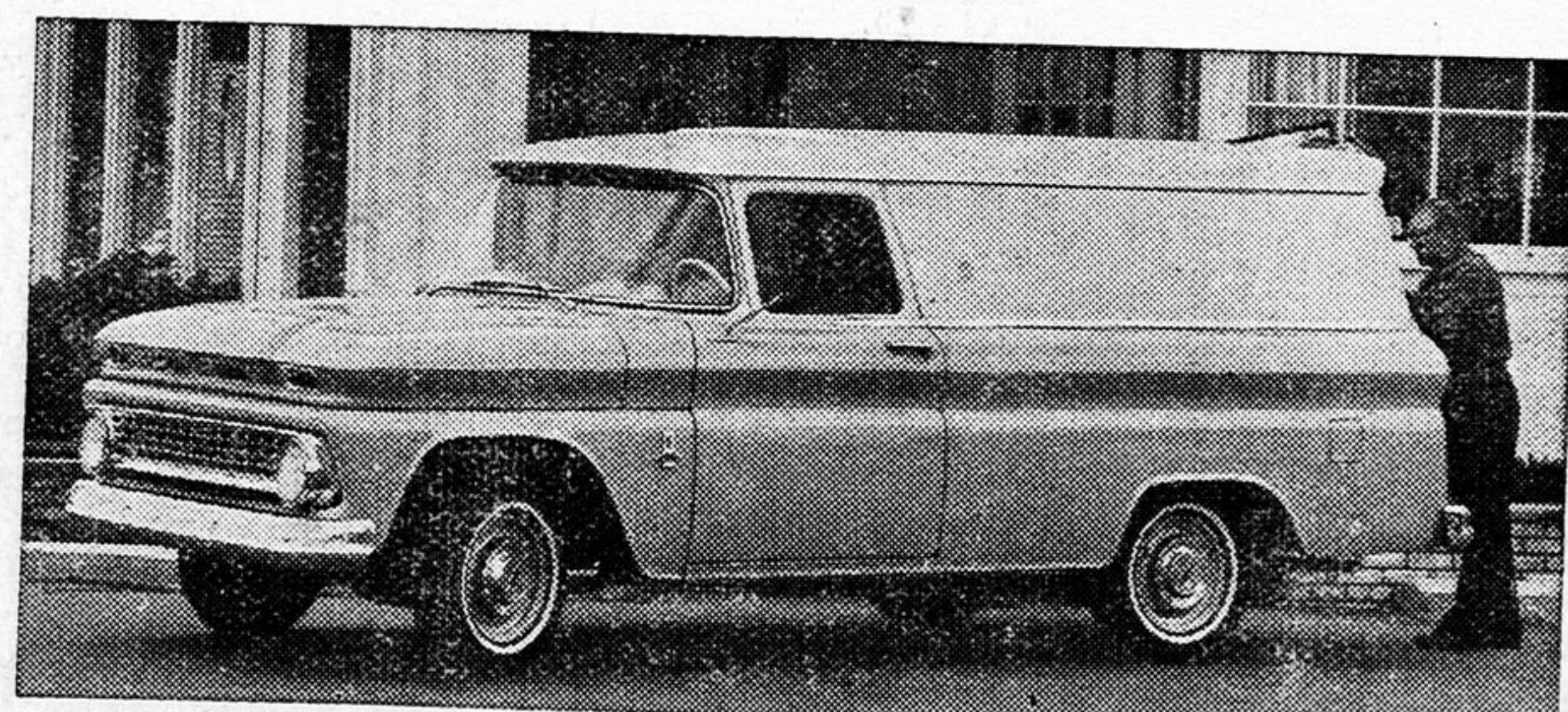

## 1963 CHEVROLET TRUCK



The 1963 Chevrolet truck line features new, lighter weight six-cylinder engines, a new 90-horsepower four-cylinder engine in 1/2-ton forward-control models; and I-beam front axles with variable rate leaf springs in medium- and heavy-duty series for better ride, durability and load capacity. The Light-Duty Panel shown here has smooth-riding coil-spring front suspension; stronger, redesigned ladder type frame and two-stage rear coil springs for the best combination of ride and load capacity. Standard equipment is a new 230 cu. in., 140-horsepower, seven bearing six, with a heavy-duty 292 cu. in., 165-horsepower six of the same design and a 283 cu. in. 175-horsepower V8 available as options.
