MILLBROOK BRANCH
HERE 60 YEARS
 The Millbrook branch of The Toronto-Dominion Bank will celebrate its 60th anniversary this year in its newly enlarged and renovated premises.

The branch first opened for business on November 18, 1902. For its years of continuous operation, Millbrook branch is among the first 50 of the 603 branches of The Toronto-Dominion Bank.

The renovation of Millbrook branch is part of a program of modernization and expansion by The Toronto-Dominion Bank to provide improved service and banking facilities throughout Canada.

Since 1955 The Toronto-Dominion Bank has built 190 new branches across Canada. Fifty of these new branches are in communities where The Toronto-Dominion Bank was not previously represented.

The Toronto-Dominion is pioneering. This year it was the first Canadian bank to

operate an electric computer cheque sorting system. Able to sort 45,000 cheques an hour, compared with 1,500 by the old system, this installation in Toronto speeds transactions between branches.

The Toronto-Dominion, in 1962, appointed Canada's first Women's Consultant. She is responsible for informing women of the services of special interest to them that are available at The Toronto-Dominion Bank; and for advising them in financial matters.

As he nears his tenth year as manager of the Millbrook Branch of The Toronto-Dominion Bank, G. Earl Liesemer has achieved the second longest record of service in that position. Of his 14 predecessors in the 60-year history of the branch, he is second only to H. A. Kerr, who was manager from 1932 to 1948.

Mr. Liesemer entered the banking service in 1922 at Galt, and, except for two years in Montreal, has gained all his banking experience in various positions at Ontario branches.

He received his first manager appointment in 1935 at Clarksburg, where he served for 14 years. In 1949 he was appointed manager of the Alliston branch and was there until 1953, when he was made manager of the Millbrook branch.

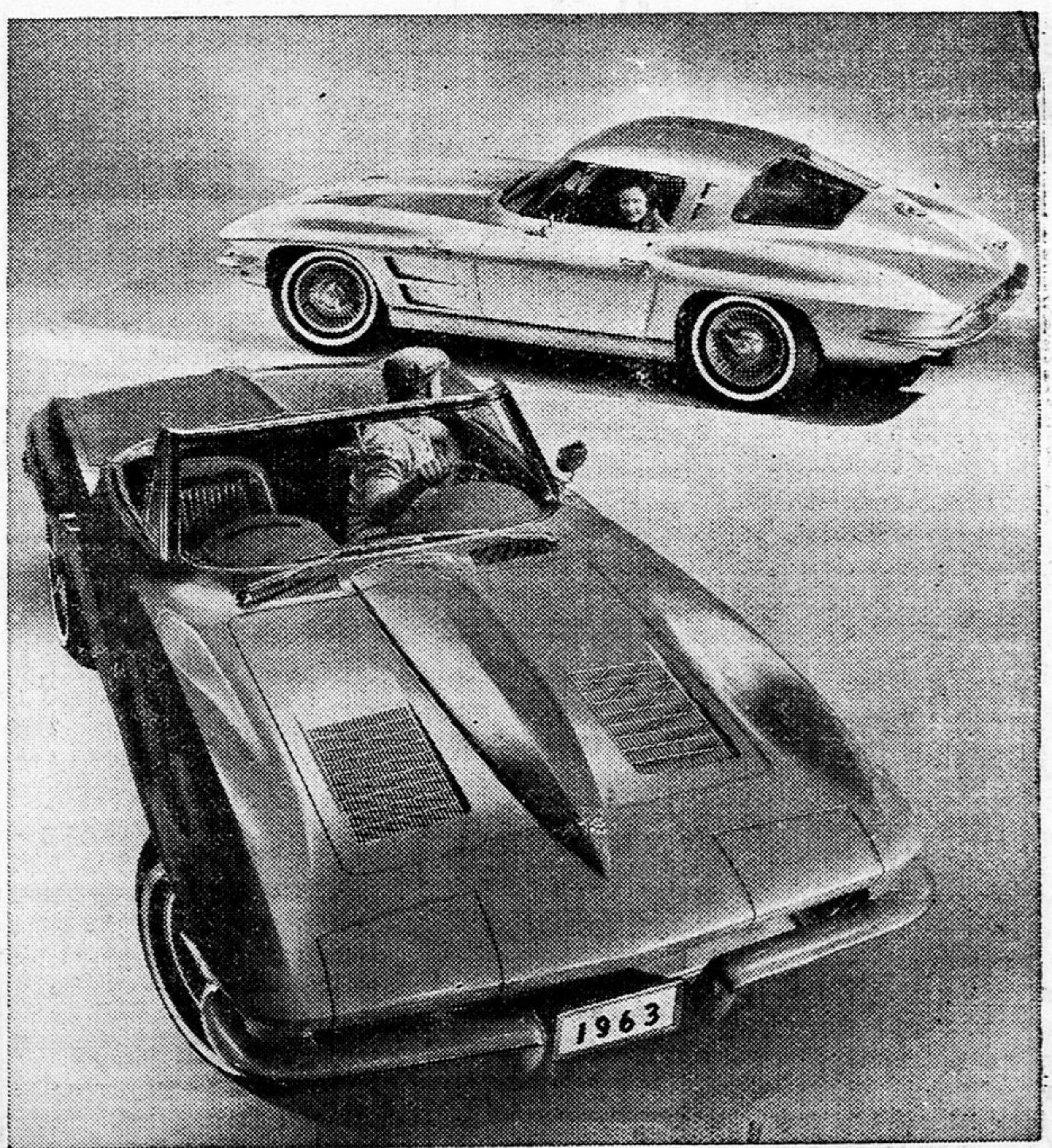
