## Fatal Accident Sunday Cast Gloom Over Whole Community

About 4.30 Sunday afternoon the fire siren sounded a long distance across countryside due to the stillness of the weather. It was soon learned however, that there was no fire but that a much worse calamity had taken place when it was found little Barbara Elizabeth Pinck, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Pinck, nee Marjorie Hubbard, had dropped down a well to her death.

Mr. and Mrs. Geo. McLeod and children of Simcoe, a sister of Mr. Pinck's, was visiting with her brother and his family for the week-end, and their son Bill, about 15 years old, and Barbara, who would have reached her seventh birthday on Sunday, October 20, undertook to wash the car. The child went to the pump to get a pail of water, and as she stepped on the well covering one of the boards gave way under her weight, letting her fall some 45 or 50 feet to the bottom. The extra fine, warm sunny day, was responsible for all the people at the home being out in the yard, and immediate help was sought. Her father, "Tommy" Pinck attempted to enter the well, but as the sides began to crumble he had to be assisted back out. The Millbrook firemen arrived in very short time and Doug Hall of Millbrook, was let down by a rope which others held, and rescued the girl from the cold water. When brought to the surface it was found she had a bad bruise on the back of her head, this may have caused her death before reaching the water. Dr. M. E. Hobbs was called and the coroner Dr. Wright, but notwithstanding all aid, life was extinct.

The little girl, who was of a very bright nature, was a faithful attendant of the Zion Pentecostal Sunday School, and that Sunday morning, which was an open session due to Thanksgiving, answered many Bible questions without hesitation. The funeral, under the direction of the J. W. Haw Funeral Home, Millbrook, took place from the Pentecostal Church on Tuesday, October 15th, at 2.00 o'clock, her Pastor M. Case and the Rev. F. C.
