Member of Parliament for the riding of Durham, has today (September 24th) been elected Vice-Chairman of the Economic and Financial Committee of the United Nations General Assembly. His nomination was proposed by the Delegation of Argentina and seconded by the Delegation of the United Kingdom.

Dr. Vivian is the Canadian Representative in the Economic and Financial Committee which is one of the seven main committees of the Assembly. This Committee will be dealing chiefly with the problems of economic assistance for the development of the less-developed countries and questions concerning international trade, including commodity problems.

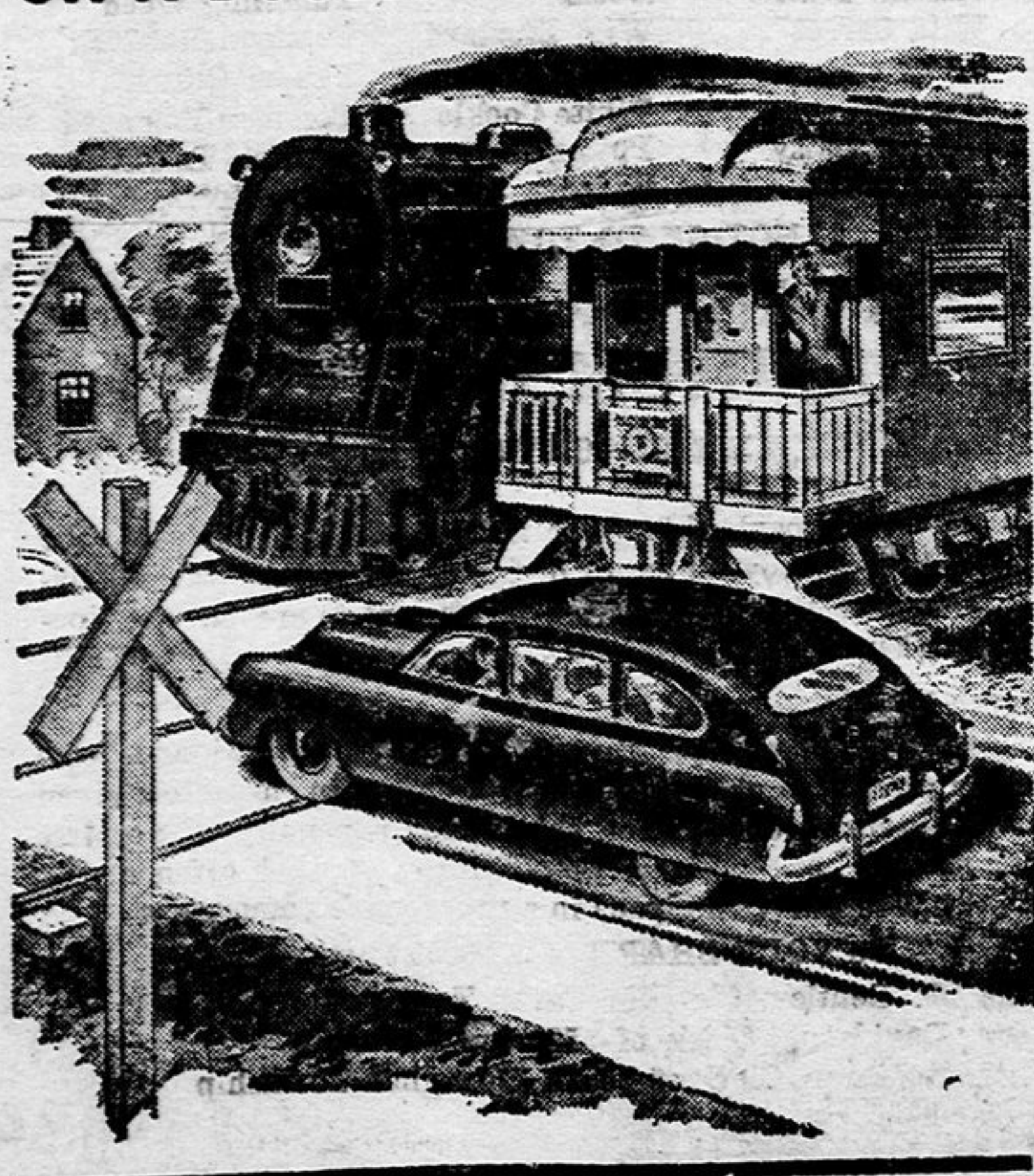
