On Saturday, September 27th, 1958, the Annual Service and Party for The Little Helpers in the Parish of Cavan was held in St. Thomas' Church and Parish Hall, Millbrook. Palfrey, conducted the service, which linked the thought of the bounties God has lavished upon the land with the thankful sharing of them with others less fortunate. This thankful sharing can be done by us all—including L. H. At the time of the offertory the L. H. walked to the Chancel steps and placed their boxes in wicker baskets. These were carried to the Secretary by the four LH Dorothy Jean Harkness of St. John's Ida, Cathie Nattress, Steven Medd and Charles White of St. Thomas' Millbrook, who then knelt while the offertory was presented and dedicated.

As rain had fallen just before the service, the games prepared by Mrs. Gordon Trick and Mrs. Reg. Dufty had to be omitted. The story period followed immediately in the flower decked Parish Hall. The L.H. listened in rapt attention to Mrs. Palfrey telling of the Shepherd and the sheep. Our Lord had said, "Feed My Sheep", and that is why we use our boxes—to help other children. The L.H. knelt together and said their special prayer.

It was now time for the mothers and the children to enjoy the refreshments provided by the W.A.'s of the 3 churches of the Parish and convened by Miss Kent.

In the meantime the mite boxes had been emptied and the offertory counted by Mrs. F. Harkness and Mrs. Wm. McCamus of St. Thomas' Church. As the L.H. left the Parish Hall each one took home a mite box for his or her own weekly offering for the work of the Church among less fortunate children all over the world.
