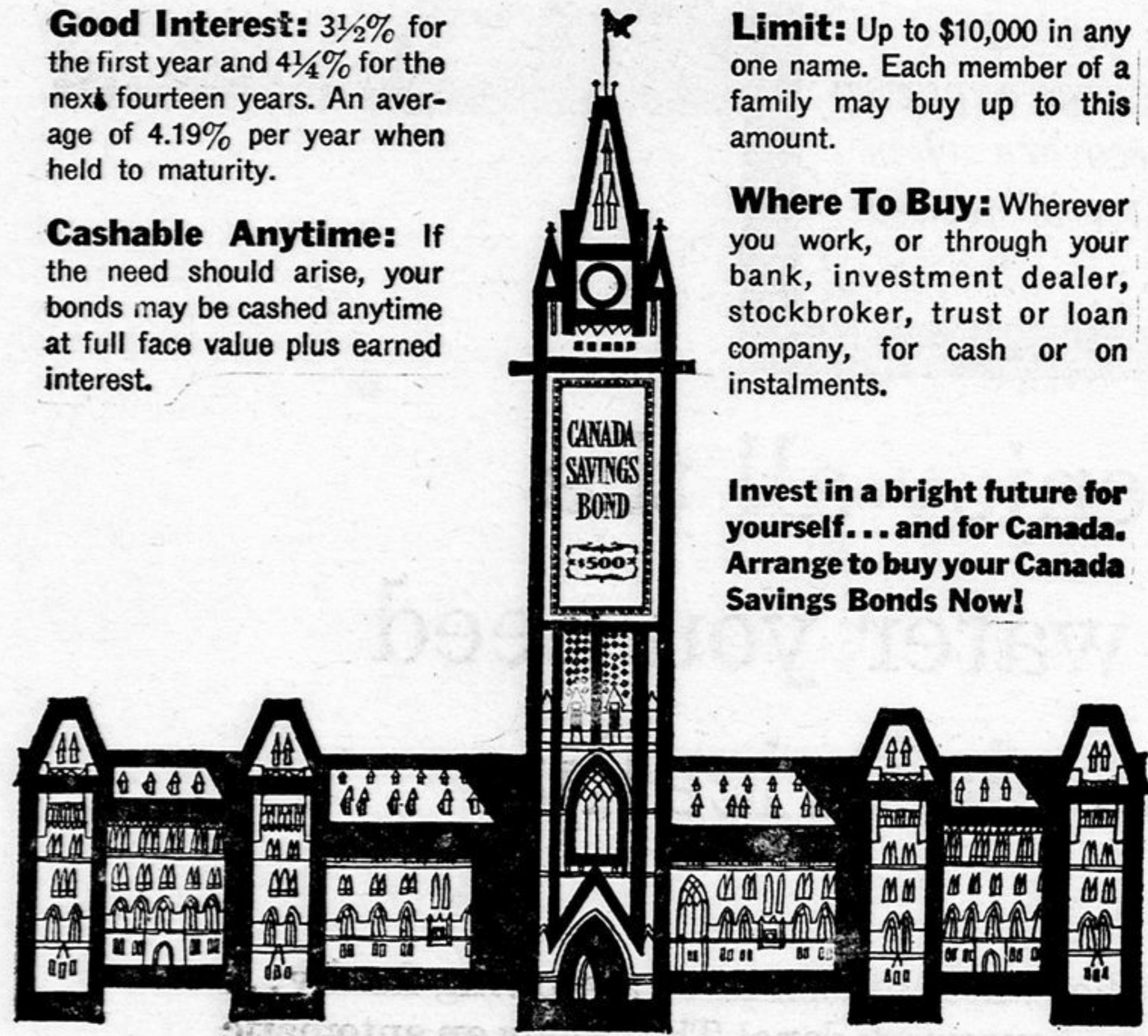

Grace Church Anniversary

Anniversary Services were held in Grace Presbyterian Church on the above date at 11 a.m. and 7.30 p.m., and there was a good attendance at the morning service and a fair attendance in the evening.

The preacher for the day was the Rev. A. Neil Miller, B.A., B.D., and D.D., who is the Stewardship and Budget Secretary of the Presbyterian Church. In the morning he took for his text the action of the Good Samaritan towards the Jew who had fallen amongst thieves as an example of what the members of the church should do, viz giving time, talent, and treasure for the welfare of the church.

In the evening he spoke on the Sector Project, a subject which has now become common amongst all the churches, and gave a glowing account of the way in which it has been taken up by many in the Presbyterian Church, and of the success it has achieved. It has not only been the means of winning the interest of the men whose sympathy had waned but also of bringing them to give more heartily for the welfare of the Church.

Choosing his text from Acts 20:28 where the Apostle Paul bade the leaders of the church "to feed the church of God".

The choir, under the leadership of Mrs. John Thompson, sang well known hymns which were heartily sustained by the congregation. In the morning they sang "His Name is Excellent", and in the evening the anthem "Thou Will Keep Him in Perfect Peace Whose Mind is Stayed Upon Thee".

Mr. Castles of Peterborough, sang two solos at each service whose splendid voice was much appreciated.

Miss Patricia Peebles presided at the organ in a most worthy fashion and the choir brought the evening service to a close in the usual way.

Application has been made to the Ontario Telephone Authority for authority to make the following charges for telephone service effective as at November 1st, 1958.

This increase from Rates established in April, 1948, is necessary due to higher operating costs, labour, all levels of taxation material, equipment and interest charges.

The Company is presently replacing and relocating lines for better service to its subscribers and has purchased land and equipment for Dial service to be established at locations removed from the central office.

Exchange Rates.

Individual Line Business \$ 6.00 per month Residence 4.25 per month

Two-party Line Business 5.00 per month Residence 3.75 per month

Multi-party line (on circuits having 3 to 10 telephones) Business 4.50 per month Residence 3.50 per month

Multi-party line (on circuits having 11 or more telephones) Business 4.35 per month Residence 3.35 per month

The above rates for individual and two-party line service will apply only within the Base Rate Areas which are defined as those areas within the municipal limits of the Village of Millbrook and within 1-2 mile of the Exchange in Cavan. If individual or two-party line service is required beyond the above limits, there will be an additional charge for extra mileage of forty-five cents a month for each 1-4 mile or fraction thereof for individual line and twenty-five cents a month for each 1-4 mile or fraction thereof for each party on a two-party line.

Extension telephone on same premises \$1.25 per month. Extension bell, small .30c per month

Extension bell, large .60c per month Service Connection charge (instrument not in place) 2.50

Service Connection charge (instrument in place) 2.00 Moving telephone on same premises 2.00
