

### Gas Officials Interview Council

The regular meeting of the Council of South Monaghan was held in the Township Hall October 7th, 1958, at 8.00 p.m. All members were present with Reeve Bothwell presiding. Minutes of the previous meeting were read by the Clerk and adopted on motion by Herb Syer, seconded by Robt Fisher.

Mr. John Daly and Mr. C. H. World of the Consumers Gas Company interviewed the Council in regards to obtaining a franchise for our municipality. These gentlemen gave a very complete explanation of the operation of their Company and the correct procedure should the Council wish to take action. However, the Council decided

to contact their solicitor and deferred Voucher No. 9 in a later date.

The Road Superintendent prepared, outlining Act to provide amount of \$548.23. After proper examination by the Council these accounts were passed for payment on motion by A. G. Anderson, seconded by George Dean.

On motion by Herb Syer, seconded by Robt. Fisher, the Clerk was instructed to open and read Tenders for snow-ploughing. This was performed and after due consideration by Council, George Dean moved, seconded by A. G. Anderson that the Tender of W. A. Cunningham be accepted at \$200.00 per month Retaining Fee, plus \$7.00 per hour up to sixty hours, at which time the Retaining Fee is reduced to \$50.00 per month, the snowplough and operator to be under the supervision of the Road Superintendent.

Correspondence received by the Clerk as follows:

Department of Public Welfare, outlining the Act to provide for the services of homemakers and nurses in case of sickness. No action was taken in this respect.

Office of the Fire Marshall, giving notice of Fire Prevention Week, October 5th to 11th.

Department of Public Welfare, enclosing cheque for sum of \$281.61 for Children's Aid Purposes.

Northumberland and Durham Health Unit, report for July and August.

Department of Lands and Forests, advising that for this year it will be impossible to declare the Township exempt from open season for deer hunting.

Department of Public Welfare, with information regarding applications for medical assistance by persons receiving Old Age Security.

Department of Highways, advising of purchase of Leon Keith Brown's property on No. 28 Highway.

Ontario Municipal Board, with approval for expenditure of \$39,740.00 for addition to Bailieboro School.

Fisher, seconded by George Dean. Third and final reading was given on motion by Herb Syer, seconded by A. G. Anderson, and accordingly the By-law was passed.
