### 36th Conference At Newcastle

The 36th Conference of the Deanery of Durham and Northumberland was held at St. George's Church, Newcastle, on September 25th. The Conference opened with the Service of Holy Communion at 10.30 a.m. The Celebrant was the Rector of St. George's, the Rev. D. R. Dewdney. There were 106 Communicants. After lunch in the town hall the members reassembled for the afternoon session. Mrs. Reginald Fallis of Millbrook presided and Mrs. C. K. Rorke of Cobourg was Secretary. After the opening prayers and hymn, Dr. Leonard F. Hatfield, General Secretary of the Council for Social Service gave a most interesting and informative address based on the year's Study Book "He Cares". As Dr. Hatfield is the Author of this book he was able to give a clear picture of the contents and pointed out some of the highlights. He said that Social Service fits in with the total work of the Church. It is the privilege and responsibility of the church to let the world know that God cares for the whole of life. Much of the Church's social service work is concerned with rehabilitation, but an ever-increasing emphasis upon prevention is evident and necessary. Our study is an attempt to look at some of the people for whom Christ cared. Mrs. Pppe, Diocesan Treasurer, spoke on finances and mentioned that the W.A. was started by a handful of dedicated women. Pledges were started to pay the salaries of two missionaries. The pledges for Toronto Diocese for this year amount to \$52,650. Mrs. Pope said that our pledges would be more than met if all the members in the Diocese would give 15c per week. She mentioned the Extra Cent a Day fund, the Hospitality fund and the United Thankoffering fund.

Miss Phyllis Napier, Diocesan Field Secretary, gave an interesting account of her work. One of her jobs is to go into new parishes and organize branches for younger women. She spoke about having tools to work with. Everyone needs tools and they have to be kept in good repair. When necessary one may have to be discarded and replaced with a new one. It is like that in the Church. God gives us tools to work with. The W.A. is the tool we have and the more we use it the more we'll love it. Why do we get disheartened and discouraged? Why haven't we gone out and invited others to use the tool that they might serve God in his Church? Mrs. G. Nicholson, Officer for Deaneries, presented the appeals and the offering, which amounted to \$56.75 after expenses, will be divided between them. The two appeals are—Ludhiana Christian Medical College in Pakistan, which has been expanded to meet government requirements, and the Refrigerator Fund—Diocese of Saskatoon, to install refrigerators in the mission houses of the district. There are 23 branches in the Deanery and 20 were represented. Miss B. McIntosh, President of St. George's Afternoon Branch, welcomed the delegates. An invitation was extended by the President of St. George's W.A. Grafton to hold the 37th Conference there. Mrs. C. Bettles of Bowmanville was appointed Little Helper's Secretary for the Deanery. The Rural Dean, Canon Bedford-Jones of St. Peter's, Cobourg, pronounced the Benediction. Afternoon tea was served by the hostess branch.

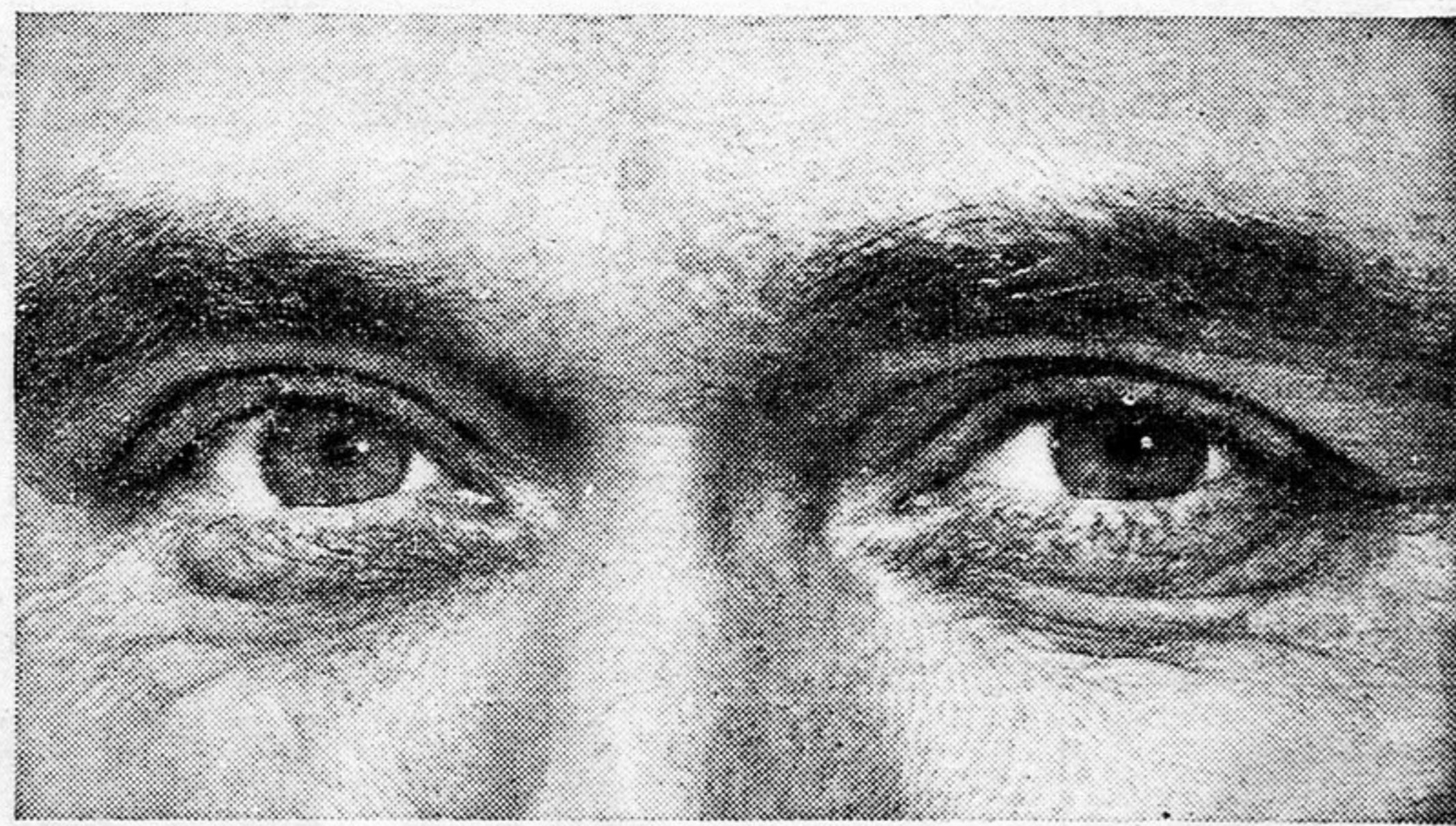
