Mrs. Etta Fisher, re trouble with bee's getting in the side of
 house, and wondering how she could get same out.
 Currelly & Foster, re if School Board had made application
 for approval for \$40,000.00 for construction of addition to School
 in North Monaghan Area No. 2.

Willmott & Irvine enclosing literature re Seymour and Cavan
 Township.
 Workmen's Compensation, awards paid during month of July.
 Durham County District High School Board, re the building
 program.

On motion of Councillors Burns and Farrow that the Clerk
 write Canadian Pacific Railways, asking if they had received any
 objections from any one re the closing of Station at Dranoel.
 Carried.

The Reeve reported that he and Mr. Elson had met the
 Council of North Monaghan re the requisition for Area No. 2. It
 was agreed to use North Monaghans mill rate for No. 2 Area until
 we were notified different.

On motion of Deputy Reeve Bradburn, Councillor Stewart
 that the Correspondence be received and filed, the Clerk to answer
 any not already dealt with. Carried.

The Reeve reported re a meeting of the Town Hall com-
 mittee and that the committee had recommended to the two
 Councils of Cavan and Millbrook that we proceed with the
 installations of the washrooms, and that Mr. Leguire tender be
 accepted, also that the east steps be repaired at once.

On motion of Councillors Burns and Stewart that the Council
 of the Township of Cavan endorse the recommendation of the
 Town Hall committee to proceed with plumbing installation re
 washroom facilities in the Town Hall, Millbrook as per tender
 price of J. Leguire. Carried.

The Clerk reported that \$2,759.50 had been paid in August
 on taxes, as follows: 1958 and prior taxes \$1,137.95; Registered
 Taxes \$1,000.00; 1959 Taxes \$621.55.

On motion of Councillor Farrow and Deputy Reeve Brad-
 burn that the Reeve be authorized to sign cheques for above
 accounts. Carried.

On motion of Councillor Farrow and Deputy Reeve Brad-
 burn that we adjourn to meet October 7th, at 1 P.M.

SPECIAL MEETING

A special meeting of the Council of the Township of South
 Monaghan was held in the Township office on August 17th, 1959
 as per adjournment of August 3rd, 1959; all members were present
 with Reeve George Dean presiding.

A motion by A. G. Anderson seconded by Robt. Fisher
 carried unanimously that by-law No. 651, being a supplementary
 by-law for \$4,000 for bridge construction be rescinded.

On motion by Herb Syer seconded by Jay Whittington the
 Clerk introduced and gave first reading to the supplementary
 by-law No. 655, being a by-law in the amount of \$6,000 to cover
 the cost of bridge construction for the year 1959.

Second reading was given on motion by Councillors Ander-
 son and Fisher.

Third and final reading was given on motion by Jay Whitting-
 ton seconded by Herb Syer, and accordingly the by-law was
 passed.

The written resignation of Mr. J. R. Perrin, the Tax Collector
 had been received by the Clerk and on presentation to the Council
 was accepted with regret on motion by Jay Whittington seconded
 by Robt. Fisher.

On instructions from the Council the Clerk had advertised
 for and received applications for the position of Tax Collector
 which were presented.

Chas. G. Pogue, Peterborough, no salary mentioned.
 F. J. Wharrick, South Monaghan, quoting a salary of \$650
 per annum and supply his own envelopes and postage.

J. E. Robinson, South Monaghan, quoting a salary of \$500
 and the Township to supply all stationery and postage.

At this point the Clerk retired from the meeting and on being
 recalled agreed to accept the appointment at a salary of \$450 per
 annum with all stationery and postage supplied, in accordance with
 a motion by Herb Syer seconded by Jay Whittington, to that effect.

At this time, on motion by R. Fisher seconded by G. Ander-
 son, the Clerk introduced and gave first reading to by-law No.
 654.

Second reading was given on motion by Herb Syer seconded
 by Jay Whittington.

Third and final reading was given on motion by R. Fisher
 seconded by Jay Whittington and accordingly the Clerk Treasurer
 received the appointment of Tax Collector.

The meeting adjourned on motion by A. G. Anderson
 seconded by Herb Syer to meet again on September 8th, 1959 at
 8 p.m.
