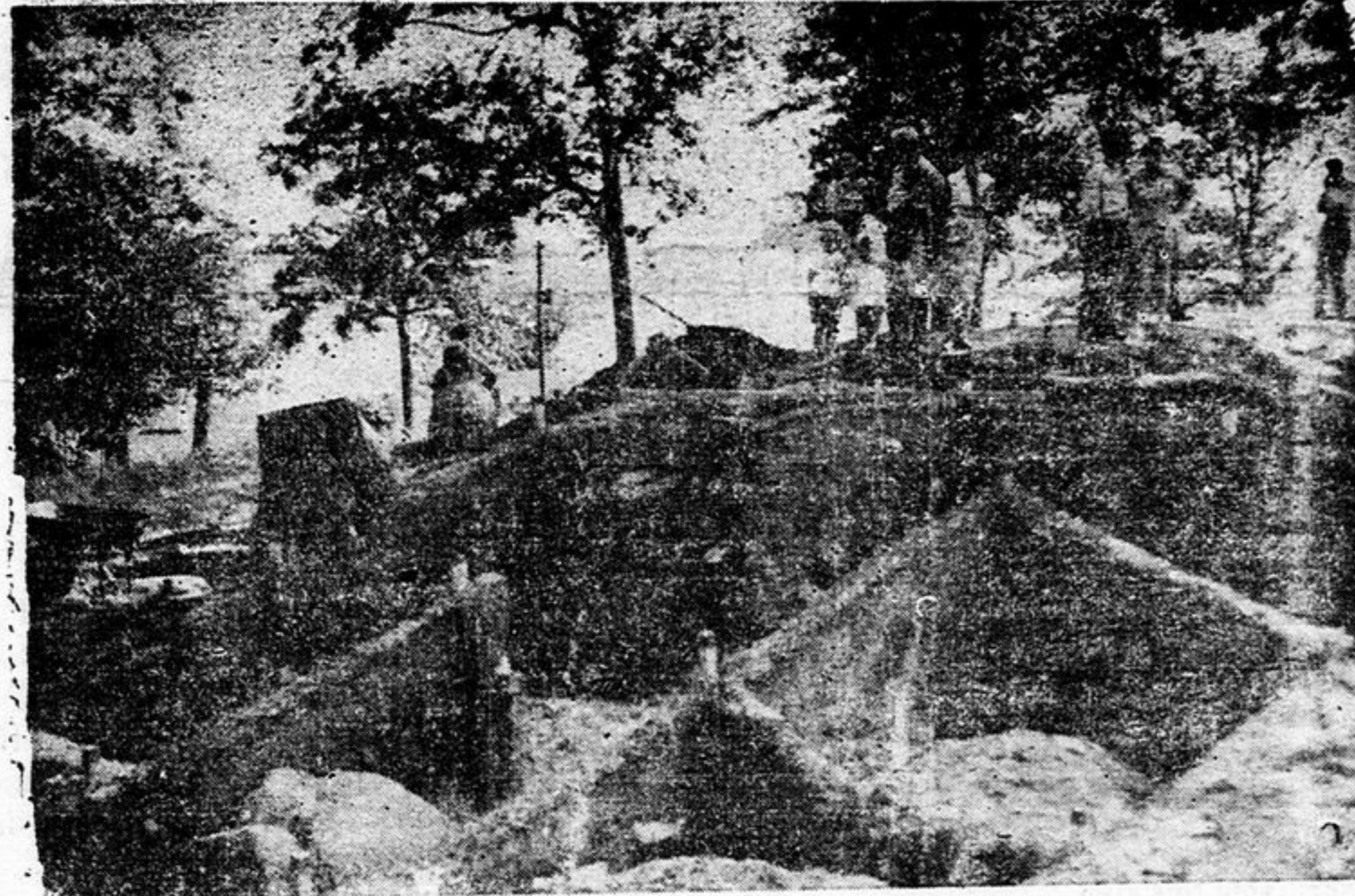

**NEW LOAN DEAL**

Canada's new Farm Credit Act allows the new Farm Credit Corporation to lend up to \$20,000 at a fixed 5% for purchase or improvement of a farm; and the loan may be based on 75% of the appraised value of the farm. Also, the Supervised Loan, for the farmer 21 to 45 years allows 75% appraised value of farm and chattels up to \$27,500.
