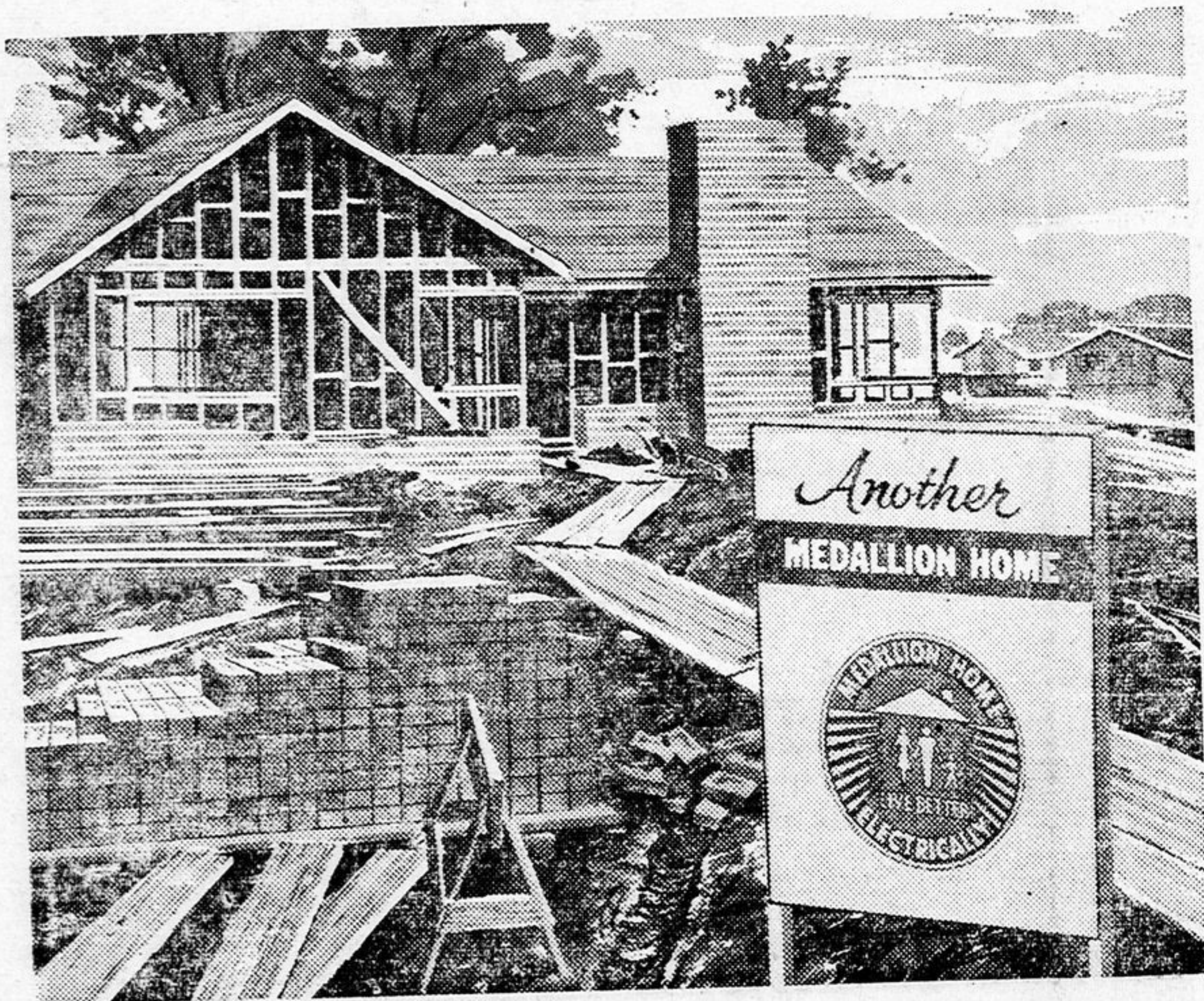

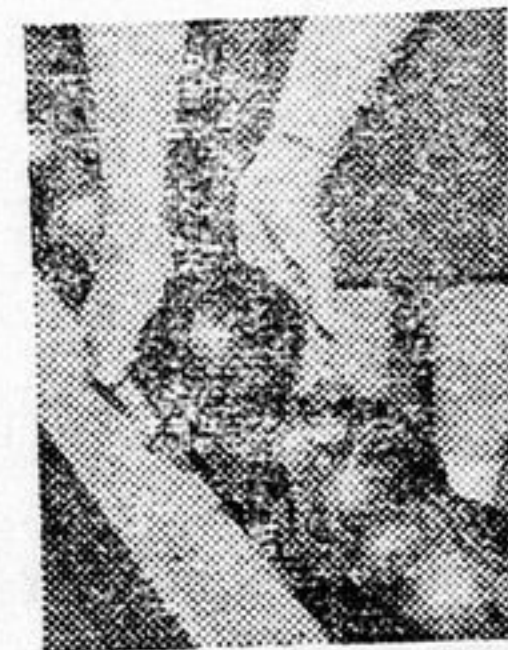
To pick up the ball, lay your hand over the top of it. Spread four fingers down along one side of the ball, your thumb down the other side. Youngsters, and people with small hands often need both hands to lift the ball from the rack.

### GETTING A GRIP ON THINGS

For a proper grip, hold the ball firmly but not tensely.

Spread your fingers normally around it, your thumb as high up on the side of it as is comfortably possible.

There should be a small hollow space between your palm and the ball. The ball is resting on your fingertips. It should be delivered off the fingers, not off the palm. If you palm the ball, you can't control the moment it leaves your hand.



A handy way to check if you are holding the ball properly is to turn your hand upside down. If the ball drops on your toe—you were palming it, not gripping it with your fingers.

All lanes provide towels, and some device to moisten hands.

Your hands should carry a trace of moisture. If too moist, the ball will feel greasy; if too dry, the ball will slip away before you deliver it.

If you moisten, then dry your hands each time before you pick up the ball, your fingers will have the same traction each ti-

me you roll.

### STAND RIGHT

### NO START RIGHT

When you take up your position, hold the ball chest-high in front of you. Use the other hand to support and steady it.



Take a comfortable position, relaxed, your shoulders squared parallel your target. "Toe-in" slightly, your toes pointing towards the target, both knees slightly bent.

If you are going to step off with your left foot, extend it an inch or two forward, the bulk of your weight on the other. If you stand with your weight evenly distributed (as most bowlers do), there is an extra movement to make, as you must shift your weight anyway before you take your first step.
