MILLBROOK BORN MAN JAMES A. ARMSTRONG DIES IN SASKATCHEWAN

Funeral services were held in the St. Paul United Church, Rocanville, on October 24, 1957, for James Cameron Armstrong, with Rev. R. Kennedy, Presbyterian Minister, of Whitewood, officiating.

Mr. Armstrong, one of the early pioneer residents of Rocanville, was born in Millbrook, Ontario, on January 4th, 1882. As a young man, he learned the barber trade and worked in the town of Listowell, Ont. In 1910 he married the former Gertrude Clarke, of Millbrook, and they moved to Rocanville, Sask. Here he opened his first barber shop, in the old Jimmie Stewart Store. He later built the shop, now owned and operated by Bob Murray. In 1931, he purchased the local hotel, which he operated till 1951. He then built what is known as the Armstrong Garage. He operated the garage, aided by his sons, Ross and Doug, until the past two years, when he had been ailing prior to his death. In all business relations, Mr. Armstrong was highly respected.

Mr. Armstrong was a strong believer in the Presbyterian Church, and a Conservative in politics. He will never be forgotten in the district, particularly by the original pioneers. He served as Overseer, and was on the local council for thirteen years. He took a wonderful interest in the New Rocanville, and for the benefit of the younger citizens, was enthusiastic in sports.

Mr. Armstrong is survived by his wife, four sons, Melville, of Saskatoon, Sask.; Ronald, Pangman, Sask.; Doug and Ross, both of Rocanville, Sask.; and two daughters, Mrs. Joe Watson (Bae) of Rocanville; Mrs. Bill McKie, (Eileen), Telford. Also surviving are seven grandsons and four granddaughters. He was predeceased by three sons, Jack, who died while in the RCAF overseas, Bruce and Billie, who died as small children in Rocanville. He is also survived by two brothers, William Henry and David, and one sister, Mrs. Belle Thorndyke, all of Millbrook, Ontario.

Interment was made in Webster's Union Cemetery. The pallbearers were G. Brooks, H. Mitchell, J. M. Gerolamy, C. Barber, Bob Murray, L. Hewgill. Those attending the service out of town were Mr. and Mrs. Doug Clarke and Mrs. Les Youngston, of Regina; H. Fee, of Alameda; Mr. and Mrs. Workman, of Oxbow; Dr. and Mrs. H. R. A CHRISTIAN COMMUNISM

Acts IV 32-37

The word Communism has got a bad name for itself because of the bad company it keeps. When we think or speak of this word we think of the so called Communism of Russia where a few self-appointed leaders have assumed to themselves the responsibilities of Government in which the rank and file of citizens are given no effective voice whatever, for the leaders have their cut and dried programmes already prepared and the citizens are warned in advance that any deviation from their programme will not be tolerated and they have a very effective way of dealing with all those who dare to deviate from the house programme of those leaders.

A glance, however, at any good dictionary will show that the so called Communism of Russia is not a true Communism which the dictionary declare is a form of Government in which all production of wealth as well as the instruments of production belong to the Community not of individuals who produce them, but of the Community whether local or national in which they are produced and not of the individual who produce them and that the people generally then should have a voice in their distribution which the iron clad despotism of Russia does not give them.

Whereas in the Communism of our text in the Apostolic Church no one of that church said any of the things which he possessed was his own but those having property sold it, bought it and laid it at the Apostle's feet and distribution was made to as many as had need. Jesus, Paul and the Apostles lived out the programme, but the Apostolic Church did not follow the programme, but their failure to make it work did not abolish the plan of God as thus outlined. It is God's programme still.

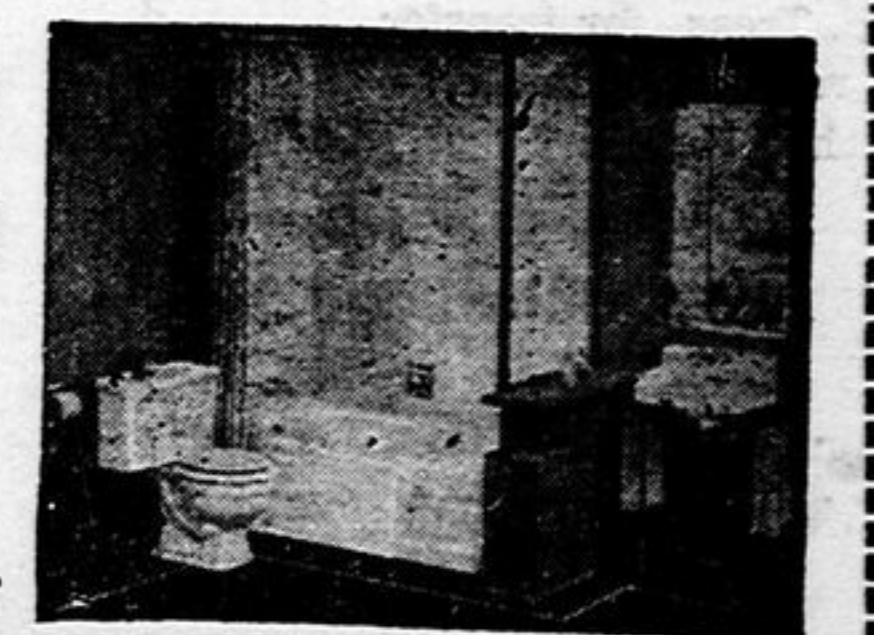
