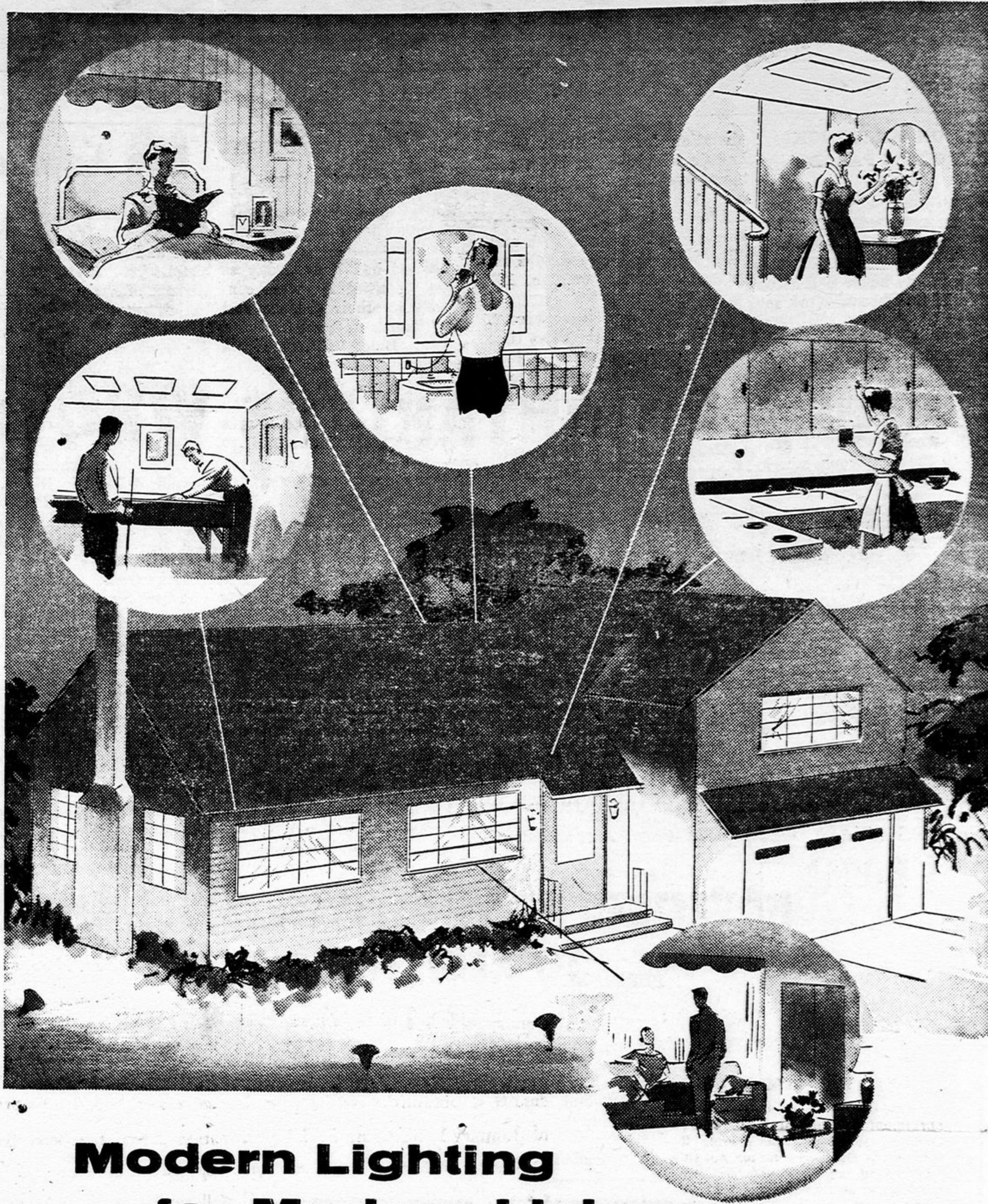

BLACK THORN CAUSE OF RUST IN OAT CROP

Johnston Rowland brought in a branch of black thorn covered with little black cherries similar to the choke cherry. He informed us that the original was brought over here from Europe as an ornamental shrub but has, like the Chinese elm, spread to be a nuisance.

This particular tree or bush grows quite plentiful now and is a hearty specimen as the leaves stay on and keep green long after others have "bit the dust", which leads to the fact that this bush or tree is the home of oat dust during the

winter, and therefore should be cut down by farmers whose farm have any of it growing.

Mr. Rowland says that where he cut the above branch the oats for a considerable distance around showed the effect of its presence.
