The firemen, assisted by a number of volunteer workers, carried out the furniture and when danger was past returned it to a room in the house that had suffered no damage from the water and smoke, which other parts of the house had done to the amount of nearly \$1000.00. Luckily for the Craig's the loss is covered by insurance, also lucky that the fire started early in the evening and not after they had retired for the night in which case much more serious results could easily have happened.

Fire Chief Douglas Sheppard and his men are to be congratulated on the fine job they did, as a fire between partitions is of the worst kind to extinguish.

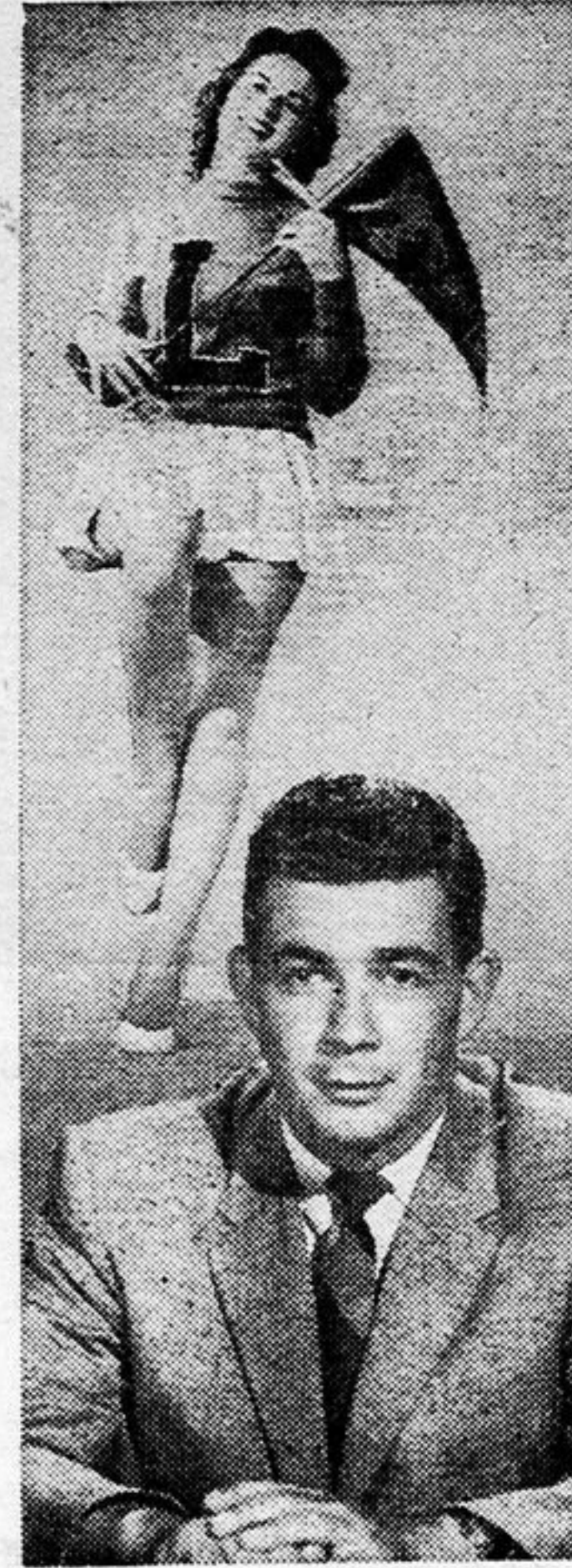
