

Minutes of The South Monaghan Council Meeting

With Reeve Rav Bothwell in the chair and all members of the council present, he called to order the regular meeting on December 2nd, at 1 p.m.

The minutes of the last regular meetings were read by the Clerk and adopted on motion of Robert Fisher seconded by G. Anderson.

Mr. Jas. Holt of Roscoe Metal Products was present and thanked the council for their business in the past and explained a slight reduction in prices for the time being.

Correspondence was received from Dept. of Public Welfare advising of a new branch in the department amalgamating, Old Age Assistance, Blind Persons Allowance, and Disabled Persons Allowance and Mother's Allowance; Report of Northumberland Health Unit; Workmen's Compensation Board giving detail of coverage; Dept. of Labour re, Trench Excavator's Protection Act; County Clerk's office advising that a Mr. August Karlison had been received at hospital as an indigent patient; Hydro Electric with several new contracts which were approved; Perly's Veriprint Service suggesting purchase of detail atlas; card of appreciation from Mrs. E. A. Summers for letter of sympathy; card of appreciation from the Bothwell family for flowers at the time of Mrs. Bothwell's death.

The clerk was asked to write Dept. of Labour for more details of Trench Excavator's Protection Act. On information given by the clerk and council it was decided to refuse hospital account of Mr. Karlison. After careful examination the council decided to return the detail atlas to Perlys. Other correspondence was ordered to be received and filed.

On motion of R. Fisher seconded by H. Syer, G. Dean and G. Anderson were appointed a committee to make enquiries for a building inspector.

Mr. J. R. Perrin the tax collector was present and reported that collections were average at this time of year.

On motion by G. Anderson seconded by G. Dean it was decided to grant the use of the township hall to the Fraserville hockey team for two more dances this winter.

A resolution was passed that the local School Board be asked to have their minutes of meetings published for the information of the ratepayers.

While on the question of road accounts the council discussed the advisability of requesting the United Counties to exchange the present county road from Bensfort to number 28 highway for the township road south from Bensfort two miles and west to the village of Bailieboro. This will be considered more seriously at the beginning of the New Year.

On motion of G. Anderson the meeting adjourned to meet again on December 16th, at 1 p.m., seconded by R. Fisher.

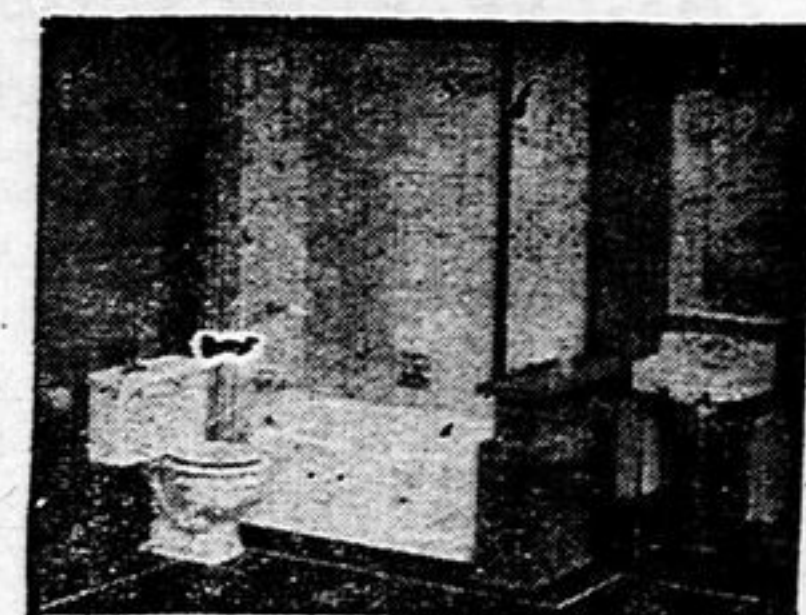

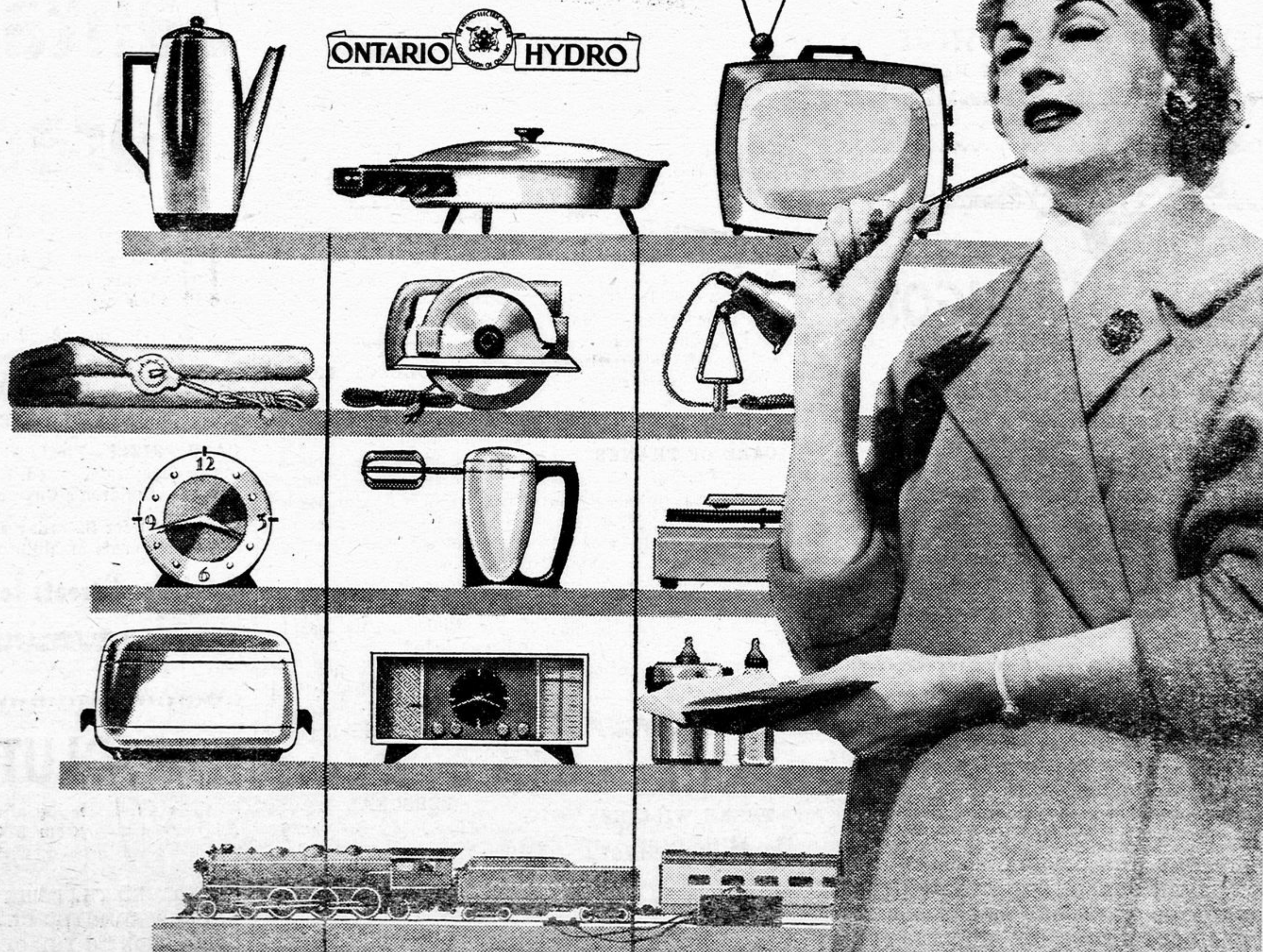
