The Rev. Mr. Herrington continued his series of sermons on the early Christian Church with Scripture lesson Acts 9:1-22. Text, Acts 9:4 "Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me?"

The apostles had chosen Mathias to fill the place of Judas, but God chose Saul of Tarsus in Cilicia, who had studied in Jerusalem under Gamaliel, probably being prepared for a Jewish Rabbi. In his zeal for Judaism he persecuted the early Christians, and was in charge of the stoning of Stephen, the first Christian Martyr. However, the witness of Stephen was the means of convincing Saul perhaps Stephen was right in proclaiming that Jesus was the Christ, and his vision of the Christ on the way to Damascus, Acts 9:1-21, lead Saul to accept Jesus as Saviour, and to witness for Jesus in Damascus, and in Jerusalem, and throughout the known world. Not everyone has such an outstanding experience at their conversion, but whether one can state the place, day, and hour of this experience is necessary, the fact remains one has come into right relationship with God.

Mrs. Stanley Northrop sang as a solo "Peace on Earth, Goodwill to Men", thus bringing the message of Christmas, and preparing us for a truly Christian Christmas season.

After the service, the congregation met to consider the calling of a minister, and decided, as Cavan had done, to leave that responsibility with the Official Board.

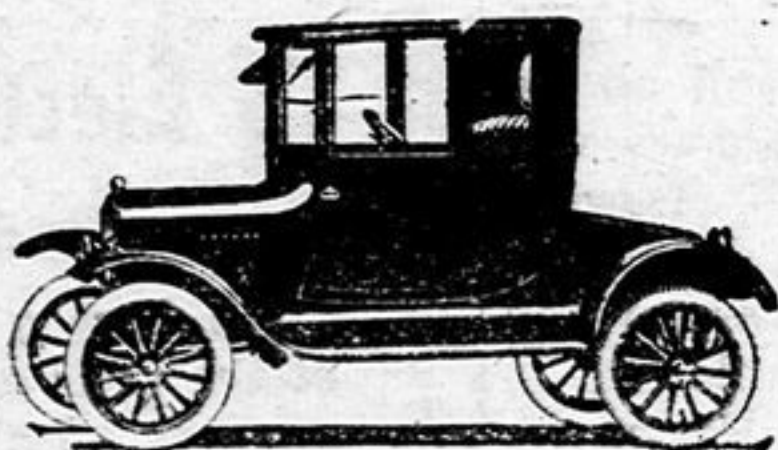

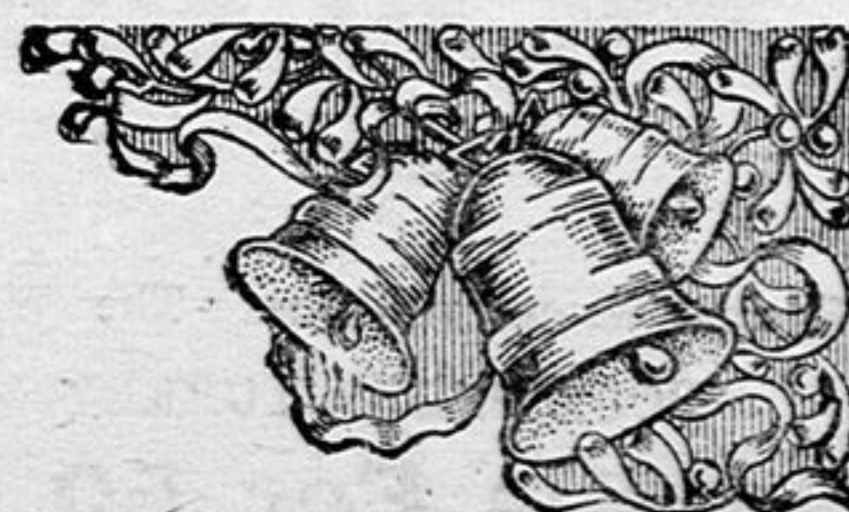

**RABIES CONTROL  
 COMMITTEE  
 RECOMMENDATIONS**

On Thursday, November 1958, a by-law was passed by the Council for the United Counties of Northumberland and Durham instituting a bounty of Four Dollars (\$4.00) on foxes killed after October 23, 1958, within the boundaries of the United Counties. The brush is to be presented to the municipal representative to claim the bounty.

In view of the seriousness of the rabies outbreak in the population, the Rabies Control Committee for the Counties of the opinion that certain precautions should be taken by hunters and others handling foxes. Mr. Garnet Rickard, Chairman, stated that the following recommendations should be carried out.

1. Do not take any dog hunting unless they have been inoculated with rabies vaccine.
2. If a fox is killed, do not handle the carcass except removed the brush. Avoid contact with the head.
3. Wear leather gloves when removing the brush.
4. Place the brush in a paper bag or carry by a string tied around the end.
5. The knife should be wiped.
