Out of Brownie funds two big balls, two skipping ropes, and a stapler have been purchased. New songs were sung and new games were played.





RABIES CONTROL COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

On Thursday, November 1958, a by-law was passed the Council for the Unit Counties of Northumberla and Durham instituting bounty of Four Dollars (\$4.0 on foxes killed after Octob 23, 1958, within the boundar of the United Counties. T brush is to be presented to municipal representative claim the bounty.

In view of the seriousness the rabies outbreak in the f population, the Rabies Conti Committee for the Counties of the opinion that certain p cautions should be taken by hunters and others handli foxes. Mr. Garnet Rickar Chairman, stated that the f lowing recommendations shou be carried out.

1. Do not take any do hunting unless they have be inoculated with rabies vaccin 2. If a fox is killed, do n handle the carcass ercept
