#### RABIES CONTROL COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

On Thursday, November 27, 1958, a by-law was passed by the Council for the United Counties of Northumberland and Durham instituting a bounty of Four Dollars (\$4.00) on foxes killed after October 23, 1958, within the boundaries of the United Counties. The brush is to be presented to a municipal representative to claim the bounty.

In view of the seriousness of the rabies outbreak in the fox population, the Rabies Control Committee for the Counties is of the opinion that certain precautions should be taken by all hunters and others handling foxes. Mr. Garnet Rickard, Chairman, stated that the following recommendations should be carried out.

1. Do not take any dogs hunting unless they have been inoculated with rabies vaccine.
2. If a fox is killed, do not handle the carcass except to remove the brush. Avoid contact with the head.
3. Wear leather gloves when removing the brush.
4. Place the brush in a paper bag or carry by a string tied around the end.
5. The knife should be wiped

off on the ground after use, and cleaned with a coal tar disinfectant at the end of the day. The gloves should also be wiped with this solution.

6. If possible, bury the carcass.

7. If a dog is known to have tangled with a fox, report the incident to the Health of Animals Division of the Canada Department of Agriculture. If this occurred in Durham County, telephone the office in Bowmanville—Market 3-5759; or for Northumberland County, the office in Belleville—Woodland 8-9658.

8. Remember, rabies is a serious disease, and the dangers of introducing the infection into the dog population must be prevented. If an animal or human once develops rabies, the illness is fatal. Be careful and do not take chance.

The Rabies Control Committee consists of the County Council, Board of Health, Health of Animals Division of the Dept. of Agriculture, Dept. of Lands and Forests, Ontario Provincial Police and the Northumberland and Durham Health Unit. The committee is concerned with all aspects of the rabies problem and will continue to issue reports from time to time.
