Reeve Bothwell having given notice of his retirement from Municipal affairs, George Dean was elected by acclamation to that office. Only the required number of councillors qualified for that position. They are as follows—A. G. Anderson, Robert Fisher, Herb Syer, and J. Whittington. For School Trustees only the required number qualified and they too were elected by acclamation. They are—Willis Patton, Robert Hazelden, William Cook.

At the conclusion of nomination, Mr. Harry Campbell, former Reeve and also former Warden of the United Counties, was appointed chairman for the evening on motion by Robert Kelly, seconded by Charlie Barnard.

Mr. Campbell called on each of those nominated to speak a few words to the ratepayers, and also indicated their regret at Reeve Bothwell's withdrawal.

After an open discussion on schools, roads and general municipal affairs, the meeting adjourned on motion by Ray Bothwell, seconded by Robert Fisher.

DR. R. P. VIVIAN SPEAKS 13th GENERAL ASSEMBLY MEETING UNITED NATIONS

Dr. R. P. Vivian (Canada) referred to "the still uncertain but improved world economic situation".

He mentioned his country's contribution of \$4 million to the 1959 U.N. technical assistance programmes, as well as its participation in other programs outside the UN framework. From 1951 through 1958, Canada's contribution to the Colombo Plan totaled more than \$231 million. He pointed out.

The necessity for an over-all appreciation of the assistance programs was stressed by Dr. Vivian. The cause of international economic aid would be seriously harmed if there were to be competition and conflict between the various agencies involved, he declared.

Dr. Vivian pointed out that, while Canada was usually considered to be a more developed country, with a high living standard and a high per capita income, it was also going through many of the same difficult economic adjustments that faced the countries in Latin America, South and South-east Asia, the Middle East and Africa.

The Canadian economy, he said, was dangerously exposed to fluctuations in the prices of primary commodities. He therefore welcomed the statement made by the United States representative earlier this week concerning the precautions taken in the disposal of U.S. agricultural surpluses so as not to displace normal commercial trade. He expressed support of the work of the commission on international commodity trade.

Dr. Vivian is our local representative in the present federal government.
