The Millbrook Public Utilities Commission have adopted the following re-adjustment of rates as approved by the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario effective for power consumed after January 1st., 1959.

DOMESTIC

A Four Step Rate Consisting Of

3.0c per KWH for first 50 Kilowatt hours per month
1.5c per KWH for next 200 Kilowatt hours per month
0.9c per KWH for next 500 Kilowatt hours per month
1.2c per KWH for all over 750 Kilowatt hours per month

Minimum Monthly Bill \$1.11 Gross

COMMERCIAL

Service Charge

50c per KW per month of connected load or maximum demand
3.0c per KWH for the first 100 hours use per month of billing demand
0.8c per KWH for the next 100 hours use per month of billing demand
0.5c per KWH for all additional consumption

Minimum Monthly Bill \$1.11 Gross

Present commercial customers having less than 5000 watts connected load will be billed as Domestic Customers in future.

POWER

Service Charge \$1.00 per KW. per month of connected load or maximum demand.

2.2c per KWH for first 100 hours use of billing demand
0.5c per KWH for next 100 hours use of billing demand
0.33c per KWH for all remaining consumption

FLAT RATE WATER HEATER RATE

.41c per 100 Watts per month.

PROMPT PAYMENT DISCOUNT on all above rates 10%
