Nearly 10,000 people from every part of Canada aided in this good work last year, sending us \$26,000.



dation, a new administration building is now under way. A cottage for the Physician and his young wife had also to be built. To provide for this outlay, and to care for patients for the coming year, we must secure at least \$50,000.
