



Had they carried out the order signaled the Edinburgh and the Nile would have shared the fale of the Camperdown and the Victoria, but at the critical moment Sir Gerard altered the course of his ship and Captain Brackenbury followed his lead. Like Nelson before him, both disobeyed an order to avert a second disaster.



The discovery was the result of a plague of moths at Gries, and the villages surrounding it. The larvae were traced to the stores of apples kept in the houses

and thence to the trees themselves. The larvae are found first of all in the apple blossoms. As the fruit grows they cluster in the conical depression about the stem of the apple.

When the fruit is taken into the house it is laden with the eggs. The propagation of the eggs is said to be prodigious. 
