





He referred to the responsibility resting on manufactur and said there are now \$2000 a paid in this town in wages to work men in our factories. Anything t can be done to bring the business n together in a united effort to benefit town he considered a good scheme a he hoped to see a successful Board Trade in Oshawa this year."
