LEADING MARKETS.

Butter - The market remains an easy one, and is quoted unchanged at 20c to 21c for solids; 19c to 20c for Dairy prints; 16c to 17c for Tubs; 15c to 16c for Cheese - The tendency of the market continues easy. Prices here are quoted unchanged at 11 1/2¢ to 12¢ for new, and 11 1/2¢ to 12¢ for old. Eggs - The damper weather has resulted in very heavy shrinkage, on account of the mixed quality of the eggs coming forward. Sales are now being made at 17¢ to 18¢. Potatoes - Are unchanged and fairly firm in tone. Ontario, 70¢ to 85¢ out of store; eastern Delawares at 85¢ to 97¢; Quebec, 78¢ and Nova Scotia at 75¢. Baled Hay - Held a firm tone, and is quoted unchanged at \$10 per ton for No. 1 Timothy and \$7.50 to \$8 for No. 2. Baled Straw - Unchanged at \$6 per ton for car lots on track here.
