Writing from Calcutta of the jute industry, Consul-General Michael says of the wages and mode of living of the mill workers:

"I visited the modern Kinnison mill, which has a capital of \$1,000,000, and the latest machinery made in England. It has 650 looms and produces 18,000 tons of bags and Hessian cloth in fifty weeks.

"The wages paid to men in the mills range from \$2 to \$3 a month, workmen from \$1.50 to \$2, and boys and girls from \$1 to \$1.75.

TURKS SENT INTO EXILE

SCORE OF MEN WHO GUIDED COUNTRY'S DESTINY.

Constantinople Is Stirred by the Fate of Statesmen and High Dignitaries.

The exiling of the erstwhile Ministers and high functionaries of state, all devoted to the late Sultan, who in August last were relegated to the island of Pringhins, is the chief subject of conversation in the capital, says a Constantinople letter.

This is due to the fact that the majority of the personages in the cosmopolitan society at Pera, on the night of Thursday were embarked on the little steamer Bauderma, of 250 tons register, belonging to the Mahosousse Company.

Thus General Riza Pasha, Minister of War during fifteen years, has been sent to Mitylene. Admiral Rame Pasha, formerly General of Marine; Yeki Pasha, formerly Grand Master of Artillery; Ahmed Raio Pasha, formerly Governor-General of the Hedjaz, and General Saad-Eddine Pasha, formerly commander of the garrison of Constantinople, were sent to Rhodes.

ISMAIL PASHA AMONG EXILES. Marshall Ismail Pasha, formerly inspector of military schools, and one of Abdul Hamid's most trusted confidants, has been sent to Boudroum. Raghib Pasha, formerly Grand Chamberlain, has been sent to Chios.

Tahsin Pasha, formerly first secretary of Abdul Hamid; Mendout Pasha, formerly Minister of the Interior, and Rechid Pasha, late prefect of the capital, have been sent to Smyrna.

All Pasha, the present Minister of Police, personally superintended the embarkation of the exiles. The indifference of many of them astonished the spectators. I am told that Riza Pasha seemed almost gay and good humored, praising the climate of Mitylene, his future compulsory residence, while Raio Pasha seemed delighted to go to Rhodes, of which he was formerly Governor.

Only two prisoners seemed depressed. These were Jahsin Pasha and Raghib Pasha. No one knows how long they will remain in exile.

THE CANADIAN ORDER OF FORESTERS THE THIRTIETH ANNUAL SESSION OF HIGH COURT.

The Year 1908 Was the Most Prosperous in the History of the Order—A Large Delegation in Attendance.

The thirtieth annual session of the High Court of the Canadian Order of Foresters opened in the city of London on Tuesday, June 23rd, with a large number in attendance, including High Court officers and delegates representing subordinate courts of every Province of the Dominion.

The High Chief Ranger, J. A. Stewart, of Perth, Ont., after extending a hearty welcome to the representatives present, submitted his report, which was replete with facts and figures showing the growth and extension of the Order during the last year.

The year closed with a membership of 70,757. The increase in the Insurance Revenue during the year amounted to \$302,249.97. On January 1, 1908, the amount on hand in this branch was \$2,738,949.54, at the close of the year \$2,738,949.54. There were 391 death claims paid, amounting to \$395,821.82.

The Sick and Funeral Benefit department is also in a flourishing condition. During the year no less a sum than \$154,371.83, covering 5,825 claims, was paid in this branch. The amount to the credit of this fund at the close of the year was \$142,626.70.

The High Chief Ranger, in concluding his address expressed the hope that the meeting would be a pleasant one for the members and felt that if there was a time in the history of the Order when the members should all feel inspired with hope and confidence in the future of Canadian Forestry, that time was the present.

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SEASONED TIMBER.

Experiments by the United States Forest Service have demonstrated that thoroughly air-dried timber has about double the strength of green timber.

Moreover, in order effectively to apply preservative agents to timber it must first be seasoned, because it is very difficult to inject antiseptics in green wood.

The loss of weight by seasoned timber is quite surprising. Western pine loses half its weight after three to five months' seasoning.
